
HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE STATE COUNCIL ON HAWAIIAN HOMESTEAD ASSOCIATIONS
TO SUPPORT CANDIDATES SEEKING ELECTION TO THE OFFICE OF
HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS WHOSE PERMANENT RESIDENCE IS ON HAWAIIAN
HOME LANDS.

1 WHEREAS, the trustees of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs are
2 elected by the people of the State of Hawaii; and

3
4 WHEREAS the kuleana (responsibility) of the trustees is to
5 improve the quality of life of all Hawaiians; and

6
7 WHEREAS, that kuleana includes service to a constituency
8 whose population meets the criteria established by the
9 Constitution of the State of Hawaii; and

10
11 WHEREAS, that constituent population includes residents of
12 Hawaiian Home Lands communities--native Hawaiians whose
13 aboriginal blood constitutes fifty per cent or more; and

14
15 WHEREAS, trustees elected to the Office of Hawaiian Affairs
16 must be cognizant of and voice the issues, concerns, and
17 solutions that impact their native Hawaiian constituency; and

18
19 WHEREAS, it would be in the best interest of this native
20 Hawaiian constituency to support candidates who reside in
21 Hawaiian homestead communities and seek election to the Office
22 of Hawaiian Affairs; and

24 WHEREAS, Hawaiian Home Lands communities are presently
25 located on all the major Hawaiian islands; and

27 WHEREAS, the State Council on Hawaiian Homestead
28 Associations, as defined by its bylaws, represents and advocates
29 for the benefit of native Hawaiians living in Hawaiian homestead
30 communities located throughout the State; now, therefore,

2 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
3 Twenty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
4 of 2006, the State Council on Hawaiian Homestead Associations is
5 requested to support candidates for the Office of Hawaiian
6 Affairs who have received the endorsement of the Hawaiian
7 Homestead Association in the homestead community in which the
8 candidate resides; and

10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
11 Resolution be transmitted to the State Council on Hawaiian
12 Homestead Associations who in turn is requested to transmit it
13 to all of its member associations; the Chairperson of the
14 Hawaiian Homes Commission; and the Chairperson of the Board of
15 Trustees of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs.
