
HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE ADOPTION OF THE UNITED NATIONS' CONVENTION ON THE
RIGHTS OF THE CHILD.

1 WHEREAS, children are our most precious resource and the
2 House of Representatives recognizes our responsibility to insure
3 them a safe, productive future; and
4

5 WHEREAS, every child holds the key to a sustainable future
6 for Hawaii and is worth the investment to provide services for
7 early childhood care, learning, and general well-being; and
8

9 WHEREAS, the principles of the Charter of the United
10 Nations affirm that the recognition of the inherent dignity and
11 the equal and inalienable rights of all members of the human
12 family is the foundation of freedom, justice, and peace in the
13 world; and
14

15 WHEREAS, the United Nations, in the Universal Declaration
16 of Human Rights and the International Covenants on Human Rights,
17 has affirmed that everyone is entitled to all the rights and
18 freedoms set forth therein, without distinction of any kind,
19 such as race, color, sex, language, religion, political or other
20 opinion, national or social origin, property, birth, or other
21 status; and
22

23 WHEREAS, the United Nations, in the Universal Declaration
24 of Human Rights, has proclaimed that each child is entitled to
25 special care and assistance; and
26

27 WHEREAS, the family, as the fundamental unit of society and
28 the natural environment for the growth and well-being of all its
29 members and particularly children, should be afforded the
30 necessary protection and assistance so that it can fully assume
31 its responsibilities with the community; and
32

33 WHEREAS, each child, for the full and harmonious
34 development of the child's personality, should grow up in an
35 environment of belonging and community, with an atmosphere of



1 aloha where happiness, love, acceptance, respect and
2 understanding abound; and
3

4 WHEREAS, to be fully prepared to participate as a member of
5 society, each child needs to be raised in the spirit of the
6 ideals of the United Nations Charter, especially in the spirit
7 of peace, dignity, tolerance, freedom, equality, and solidarity;
8 and
9

10 WHEREAS, on November 20, 1989, the United Nations General
11 Assembly adopted the Convention of the Rights of the Child; and
12

13 WHEREAS, one hundred ninety-two nations have entered as
14 signatories to the Convention of the Rights of the Child; and
15

16 WHEREAS, the preamble to the State of Hawaii Constitution
17 proclaims that the State of Hawaii is dedicated to the
18 fulfillment of the state motto, "Ua mau ke ea o ka aina i ka
19 pono," meaning, "The life of the land is perpetuated in
20 righteousness"; and
21

22 WHEREAS, children are the trustees of the legacy of human
23 culture and sustainability of Hawaii; and
24

25 WHEREAS, to protect, nurture, and treasure our keiki is an
26 underlying principle for Hawaii as a Pacific island community;
27 now, therefore,
28

29 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
30 Twenty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
31 of 2006, that this body urges the State of Hawaii to adopt the
32 United Nations' Convention on the Rights of the Child; and

34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature urges the
35 President to request that Congress ratify the Convention on the
36 Rights of the Child; and
