
HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WORKING GROUP TO PROTECT THE BATOIDEA ORDER, INCLUDING MANTA RAYS FROM POACHING AND FISHING.

- 1 WHEREAS, Hawaii is fortunate that its island waters are
2 home to graceful and beautiful manta rays; and
3
4 WHEREAS, manta rays are most commonly found off the Kona
5 Coast on the island of Hawaii; and
6
7 WHEREAS, the number of manta rays that exist is unknown,
8 and because the focus of studies has been on whales, dolphins,
9 and sharks, little research has been conducted on manta rays;
10 and
11
12 WHEREAS, as a result, manta rays have not received the
13 amount of attention they are due with regard to research and
14 conservation; and
15
16 WHEREAS, in other parts of the world, manta rays are killed
17 because they are considered a delicacy, and a new market has
18 emerged in Asia whereby manta rays are used as an ingredient in
19 traditional medicines; and
20
21 WHEREAS, there is fear that the harvesting of manta rays
22 could spread to the western Pacific; and
23
24 WHEREAS, because of their low reproductive rate, there is
25 great concern that manta rays may be depleted in certain parts
26 of the world; and
27
28 WHEREAS, while manta rays are not hunted commercially in
29 Hawaii, there are currently no laws protecting manta rays; and

1 WHEREAS, preventive action should be taken now to ensure
2 the protection of manta rays in Hawaii's waters; now, therefore,
3

4 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
5 Twenty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
6 of 2006, that the Department of Land and Natural Resources
7 (DLNR) is requested to partner with each of the county councils
8 and other related state agencies to establish a working group to
9 determine methods to protect the batoidea order, including manta
10 rays from poaching and fishing; and
11

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested
13 to:
14

- 15 (1) Research and pursue all possible means of protecting
16 the batoidea order, including manta rays;
17
18 (2) Draft proposed administrative rules to prevent
19 poaching, fishing, or killing of species under the
20 batoidea order; and
21
22 (3) Determine the appropriate state agency to be
23 responsible for enforcing the administrative rules;

27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that DLNR is requested to submit a
28 report to the Legislature of its findings and progress to
29 implement administrative rules, including suggested legislation
30 if necessary, no later than 30 days prior to the convening of
31 the Regular Session of 2007; and

33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if significant protection is
34 not achieved by January 2007, the Legislature may consider
35 enacting laws to implement 100 percent protection of all manta
36 rays; and



1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
2 Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of
3 Land and Natural Resources and chairpersons of the county
4 councils of Hawaii, Maui, Honolulu, and Kauai.
