
HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO COMPLY WITH COUNTY ORDINANCES AND STANDARDS RELATING TO OUTSIDE LIGHTING AT AIRPORTS AND HARBORS, AND TO PROVIDE CUT-OFF OR FULLY SHIELDED LENS FIXTURES TO DIRECT ARTIFICIAL LIGHTING DOWNWARD TO PREVENT DIFFUSION THE LIGHT INTO THE ATMOSPHERE, ON THE ISLAND OF HAWAII AND THE ISLAND OF MAUI.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii is home to two of the world's premier
2 astronomy observatories, Haleakala on Maui and Mauna Kea on
3 Hawaii; and
4

5 WHEREAS, Mauna Kea is considered to be the finest site for
6 astronomy observation in the world; and
7

8 WHEREAS, one of the most critical needs for preserving the
9 value of these sites is to reduce bright sources of light that
10 illuminate the dark night sky; and
11

12 WHEREAS, recent nighttime images from the international
13 space station revealed that some of the brightest sources of
14 light on Maui and Hawaii are the airports and harbors on both
15 islands; and
16

17 WHEREAS, astronomers on Mauna Kea are now detecting
18 artificial light sources from urban areas that diminish the
19 telescopes' ability to do research; and
20

21 WHEREAS, over the last decade, artificial lighting on the
22 island of Hawaii has slowly increased, and is now threatening
23 the ability of the telescopes on Mauna Kea to study faint
24 objects in the night sky; and
25

26 WHEREAS, the spectral signatures of high-pressure sodium
27 lamps and mercury lamps are now seen, despite Hawaii County
28 attempts to regulate those sources by ordinance; and

30 WHEREAS, a dark night sky is essential to the continued
31 success of the Mauna Kea observatories; and

1 WHEREAS, every one percent of artificial brightening of the
2 night sky results in an effective loss of telescope aperture by
3 one percent; and
4

5 WHEREAS, according to scientists at Mauna Kea observatory,
6 much of the lighting at the airports and harbors on the Island
7 of Hawaii does not conform to the county lighting ordinance that
8 was intended to protect the dark sky over Mauna Kea; and
9

10 WHEREAS, the ramp lighting at Kahului Airport points
11 directly at the summit of Haleakala and is not properly
12 shielded; and
13

14 WHEREAS, the lighting along the approach road to Kona
15 Airport, along the roads where the rental car companies are
16 located at Kona Airport, and in the Hilo Airport parking lot
17 should be changed to low-pressure sodium lighting so that
18 astronomers would be better able to filter out light emitted
19 from them; and
20

21 WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation has jurisdiction
22 over commercial harbor pursuant to chapter 266, Hawaii Revised
23 Statutes, and over airports pursuant to chapter 261; and
24

25 WHEREAS, it is essential that the Department of
26 Transportation take immediate steps to diminish the adverse
27 effects on astronomy of bright night lights at airports and
28 harbors on the island of Hawaii and the island of Maui; now,
29 therefore,
30

31 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
32 Twenty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
33 of 2006, that the Department of Transportation is requested to
34 comply with county ordinances and standards relating to outside
35 lighting to the extent practicable and not in conflict with any
36 safety regulation or federal law, regulation, or mandate, and to
37 provide cut-off or fully shielded lens fixtures to direct
38 artificial lighting downward to prevent diffusion the light into
39 the atmosphere, at airports and harbors in the County of Hawaii
40 and the County of Maui; and

42 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of
43 Transportation work collaboratively to resolve or otherwise




1 ameliorate the bright night light problem with the appropriate
2 county agencies of Hawaii and Maui; and
