
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMERCIAL DRIVER LICENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 286-239, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:
3 "(g) An initial or renewed commercial driver's license
4 with a hazardous materials endorsement shall expire no later
5 than five years from its date of issuance, except if the
6 licensee is seventy-two years of age or older. The expiration
7 date of a commercial driver's license with a hazardous materials
8 endorsement shall be the same expiration date as the hazardous
9 materials endorsement. If the licensee is seventy-two years of
10 age or older, the initial or renewed commercial driver's license
11 with a hazardous materials endorsement shall not exceed two
12 years. All other initial commercial driver's [license] licenses
13 shall be valid for not less than a two- or six-year period,
14 beginning on the driver's birthday. [Renewal] All other renewed
15 licenses shall be valid for not more than a two- or six-year
16 period from the expiration date of the previous valid license.
17 [The] With the exception of a commercial driver's license with a
18 hazardous materials endorsement, the commercial driver's license


1 shall expire on the next birthday of the licensee occurring six
2 years after the date of issuance of the license unless sooner
3 revoked, suspended, or canceled; provided that, unless sooner
4 revoked, the license shall expire on the second birthday of the
5 licensee following the issuance of the license if at that time
6 the licensee is seventy-two years of age or older."

7 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

9 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
