
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMATION SECURITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Identity theft is one of the fastest growing
2 crimes committed throughout the United States, including Hawaii.
3 The privacy and financial security of individuals are
4 increasingly at risk due to the widespread collection of
5 personal information. In response to concerns over the security
6 of personal information contained in government records, the
7 legislature finds that the department of accounting and general
8 services is currently in the process of establishing a cyber
9 security office to address information security programs,
10 policies, and procedures for executive departments.

11 The purpose of this measure is to direct the preparation of
12 a report on the status of the cyber security office and to
13 ensure that other state agencies in addition to the executive
14 departments are consulted to ensure maximum integration in
15 development of related policies and procedures.

16 SECTION 2. (a) The department of accounting and general
17 services shall report on the status of the cyber security office



1 and its efforts to develop policies and procedures to address
2 information security that:

3 (1) Are commensurate with the risk and magnitude of the
4 harm resulting from unauthorized access, use,
5 disclosure, disruption, modification, or destruction
6 of either information collected or maintained by or on
7 behalf of each department or information systems used
8 or operated by each department;

9 (2) Include policies and procedures for all departments
10 that cost-effectively reduce information security
11 risks to acceptable levels; and

12 (3) Ensure that information security is addressed
13 throughout the life cycle of each department's
14 information system.

15 (b) The department shall also consult with the department
16 of education, the University of Hawaii, the judiciary, and the
17 legislature to ensure that the policies and procedures of the
18 departmental cyber security office integrate with any comparable
19 information security policies and procedures developed or under
20 construction by these agencies. If available, the above-
21 mentioned agencies shall provide an update of their information



1 security policies and procedures to be included as part of the
2 department's report.

3 (c) The department shall submit a report on its efforts to
4 monitor, analyze, prevent, and mitigate cyber security issues
5 for executive departments, including the development of policies
6 and procedures, and any necessary proposed legislation, to the
7 legislature not later than twenty days prior to the convening of
8 the regular session of 2007.

9 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2060.
