
A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII FOR CAMPUS SECURITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the University of
2 Hawaii at Manoa is currently facing a campus security staffing
3 shortage due to military leave. Since September 11, 2001,
4 campus security measures have been implemented that have
5 required a substantial amount of time, money, and resources. In
6 order to ensure the safety of faculty, staff, students, and
7 other members of the university community, it is critical that
8 more campus security officers are hired to continue these
9 services on campus to prevent and deter criminal activity.

10 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to hire
11 sixteen campus security officers for the University of Hawaii at
12 Manoa campus.

13 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$480,000, or so much
15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for
16 sixteen campus security officer I positions (SR-14) for the
17 University of Hawaii at Manoa.



1 SECTION 3. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
2 University of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
