
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to prohibit the use
2 or sale of non-aerial common fireworks on the Fourth of July in
3 counties with populations over 500,000.

4 SECTION 2. Section 132D-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5 amended to read as follows:

6 **"§132D-3 Permissible uses of non-aerial common fireworks.**

7 [~~Non-aerial~~] (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), non-
8 aerial common fireworks may be set off, ignited, discharged, or
9 otherwise caused to explode within the State only:

10 (1) From 9:00 p.m. on New Year's Eve to 1:00 a.m. on New
11 Year's Day; from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Chinese New
12 Year's Day; and from 1:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on the
13 Fourth of July; or

14 (2) From 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. as allowed by permit
15 pursuant to section 132D-10 if the proposed cultural
16 use is to occur at any time other than during the
17 periods prescribed in paragraph (1);

4 (b) In counties with populations over five hundred
5 thousand, the sale or use of non-aerial common fireworks on the
6 Fourth of July is prohibited."

7 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

9 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on August 1, 2006.
