# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 201G, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended by adding a new section in part IV to be appropriately  
3 designated and to read as follows:

4           "§201G- Temporary emergency housing. (a) In addition  
5 to any other duties prescribed by law, the corporation shall  
6 coordinate with the four counties a procedure for identifying  
7 locations that shall be used for temporary emergency shelters  
8 for homeless individuals and families.

9           (b) Each county shall be responsible for locating,  
10 designating, and maintaining the areas that shall be used for  
11 temporary emergency shelters. The designated locations may  
12 include public parks or established homeless facilities."

13           SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general  
14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the following sums, or so much  
15 thereof as may be necessary for the fiscal year 2006-2007, to  
16 assist the counties in implementing this Act:

4 SECTION 3. The sums appropriated shall constitute the  
 5 State's share of the cost of mandated programs under article  
 6 VIII, section 5, of the state constitution.

7 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

8 SECTION 5. Section 1 of this Act shall take effect upon  
 9 its approval. Sections 2 and 3 of this Act shall take effect  
 10 upon July 1, 2006.
