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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMATION SECURITY.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. Section 26-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3           "**§26-6 Department of accounting and general services.** (a)

4 The department of accounting and general services shall be  
5 headed by a single executive to be known as the comptroller.

6           (b) The department shall:

- 7           (1) Preaudit and conduct after-the-fact audits of the  
8 financial accounts of all state departments to  
9 determine the legality of expenditures and the  
10 accuracy of accounts;
- 11           (2) Report to the governor and to each regular session of  
12 the legislature as to the finances of each department  
13 of the State;
- 14           (3) Administer the state risk management program;
- 15           (4) Establish and manage motor pools;
- 16           (5) Manage the preservation and disposal of all records of  
17 the State;



- 1           (6) Undertake the program of centralized engineering and  
2           office leasing services, including operation and  
3           maintenance of public buildings, for departments of  
4           the State;
- 5           (7) Undertake the functions of the state surveyor;
- 6           (8) Establish accounting and internal control systems;
- 7           (9) Provide centralized computer information management  
8           and processing services, coordination in the use of  
9           all information processing equipment, software,  
10          facilities, and services in the executive branch of  
11          the State, and consultation and support services in  
12          the use of information processing and management  
13          technologies to improve the efficiency, effectiveness,  
14          and productivity of state government programs; and
- 15          (10) Establish, coordinate, and manage a program to provide  
16          a means for public access to public information and  
17          develop and operate an information network in  
18          conjunction with its overall plans for establishing a  
19          communication backbone for state government.
- 20          (c) The state communication system shall be established  
21          to:



- 1           (1) Facilitate implementation of the State's distributed  
2           information processing and information resource  
3           management plans;
- 4           (2) Improve data, voice, and video communications in state  
5           government;
- 6           (3) Provide a means for connectivity among the state,  
7           university, and county computer systems; and
- 8           (4) Provide a long-term means for public access to public  
9           information.
- 10          (d) The department may adopt rules as may be necessary or  
11         desirable for the operation and maintenance of public buildings,  
12         and for the operation and implementation of a program to provide  
13         a means for public access to the State's information network  
14         system and public information. The rules shall be adopted  
15         pursuant to chapter 91.
- 16          (e) The King Kamehameha celebration commission shall be  
17         placed within the department of accounting and general services  
18         for administrative purposes. The functions, duties, and powers,  
19         subject to the administrative control of the comptroller, and  
20         the composition of the commission shall be as heretofore  
21         provided by law.



1 (f) The functions and authority heretofore exercised by  
2 the comptroller, board of commissioners of public archives, the  
3 archivist, the disposal committee, and the insurance management,  
4 surplus property management, and central purchasing functions of  
5 the bureau of the budget and the nonhighway functions of the  
6 department of public works as heretofore constituted are  
7 transferred to the department of accounting and general services  
8 established by this chapter.

9 (g) The department shall also develop no later than  
10 January 1, 2007, a statewide information security protection  
11 program, to be implemented by the other departments, that is  
12 commensurate with the risk and magnitude of the harm resulting  
13 from unauthorized access, use, disclosure, disruption,  
14 modification, or destruction of either information collected or  
15 maintained by or on behalf of each department or information  
16 systems used or operated by each department. The department  
17 shall update the program on no later than an annual basis.

18 The department shall also establish policies and procedures  
19 for all departments that cost-effectively reduce information  
20 security risks to acceptable levels and ensure that information  
21 security is addressed throughout the life cycle of each  
22 department's information system."



1 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general  
 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ , or so  
 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, to  
 4 establish the information security protection program  
 5 established under this Act.

6 SECTION 3. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the  
 7 department of accounting and general services for the purposes  
 8 of this Act.

9 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

10 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
