A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new section to part V to be appropriately
3 designated and to read as follows:

4 "§302A- Categorization of school capital improvement
5 projects when submitted for review by the department of budget
6 and finance and the legislature. The department of education,
7 when submitting its priorities for school capital improvement
8 projects for review by the department of budget and finance and
9 the legislature, shall divide its capital improvement projects
10 into two categories as follows:

- 11 (1) One category for schools that were originally
12 constructed at least twenty-five years prior to the
13 submission of the priority list; and
- 14 (2) One category for schools that were originally
15 constructed not more than twenty-five years prior to
16 the submission of the priority list."



1 SECTION 2. Section 37-68, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 **"§37-68 Responsibilities of agencies.** Under such rules as
4 may be prescribed by the director of finance with the approval
5 of the governor:

6 (1) Every agency assigned the task of developing programs
7 and preparing program and financial plans, budgetary
8 requests, and program performance reports shall
9 develop such programs and prepare such plans,
10 requests, and reports and submit the same to the
11 director of finance at such times, on such forms, and
12 in such manner as the director may prescribe. For
13 informational purposes, the University of Hawaii shall
14 submit its program and financial plans, budgetary
15 requests, and program performance reports to the
16 legislature at the same time the university submits
17 them to the director of finance. Where new programs
18 are being proposed, every agency shall demonstrate
19 that the program:

20 (A) Is an appropriate function of state government;
21 and, as applicable



1 (B) Can be implemented by the public sector as cost-
2 effectively as the private sector while meeting
3 the same plans, goals, objectives, standards,
4 measures of effectiveness, wage, salary,
5 conditions of employment, and employee benefit
6 programs of the State;

7 (2) Every agency administering state programs and every
8 agency responsible for the formulation of programs and
9 the preparation of program and financial plans,
10 budgetary requests, and program performance reports,
11 shall furnish the department of budget and finance all
12 such documents and information as the department may
13 from time to time require. The department of
14 education, when submitting its priorities for school
15 capital improvement projects, shall divide its capital
16 improvement projects into two categories as follows:

17 (A) One category for schools that were originally
18 constructed at least twenty-five years prior to
19 the submission of the priority list; and

20 (B) One category for schools that were originally
21 constructed not more than twenty-five years prior
22 to the submission of the priority list.



1 Each agency shall make available to the legislature,
 2 and any member or committee of either house of the
 3 legislature, all documents and information as may be
 4 requested; and

5 (3) The director of finance or any employee of the
 6 department of budget and finance, when duly
 7 authorized, for the purpose of securing information,
 8 shall have access to and may examine any books,
 9 documents, papers, or records of any agency."

10 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
