
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

SUPPORTING THE UNITED STATES FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION'S
NATIONAL CAMPAIGN TO RAISE AWARENESS AND INFORM WOMEN ABOUT
MENOPAUSAL HORMONE THERAPY AND DESIGNATING SEPTEMBER AS
MENOPAUSE AWARENESS MONTH IN HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, in 2004, as part of its nationwide information
2 campaign to raise awareness about the resources available
3 relating to the benefits and risks of hormone therapy for
4 menopausal symptoms, the Food and Drug Administration of the
5 United States Department of Health and Human Services designated
6 September as National Menopause Awareness Month; and
7

8 WHEREAS, in 2005, more than fifty million American women
9 were affected by menopause; with more than 156,239 women in
10 Hawaii over fifty years of age, many are experiencing the
11 effects of menopause; and
12

13 WHEREAS, according to the American College of Obstetricians
14 and Gynecologists, "the result will be a national health concern
15 of dramatic proportions, unless women are better educated about
16 the changes of menopause and the measures that can prolong and
17 enhance their lives"; and
18

19 WHEREAS, to avert the potential national health crisis, the
20 federal Food and Drug Administration's Office of Women's Health
21 provides women with the latest, most helpful educational
22 information on menopausal hormonal therapy to help women make
23 the best decision for them; and

25 WHEREAS, if not properly treated by a trained physician or
26 nurse practitioner, the health risks of pre-menopausal and post-
27 menopausal women can result in an increased number of women
28 afflicted by osteoporosis and cardiovascular disease, in



1 addition to living with other symptoms that affect quality of
2 life, such as rapid heart beat, depression, and hot flashes; and
3

4 WHEREAS, estrogen depletion, which occurs in menopause,
5 results in an increase in cardiovascular disease and
6 osteoporosis, resulting in more than five hundred thirty
7 thousand deaths of women each year; these numbers could reach
8 staggering proportions with the aging of the "Baby Boom"
9 generation; now, therefore,

11 WHEREAS, because menopause is a serious public health
12 issue, as well as a significant concern for individual women, at
13 least fifteen states have followed the United States Food and
14 Drug Administration and declared September as "Menopause
15 Awareness Month" in their own state; and

17 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-third
18 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2006, the
19 House of Representatives concurring, that the Legislature
20 supports the United States Food and Drug Administration's
21 national information campaign to raise awareness about the
22 recent findings on the risks and benefits of menopausal hormone
23 therapy by educating women about menopausal hormone therapy
24 choices; and

26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED in further support of the Food and
27 Drug Administration's national information campaign, the
28 Legislature also designates September 2006 as Menopause
29 Awareness Month in Hawaii; and

31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
32 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health,
33 the President of the Hawaii Medical Association, and the
34 President of the Board of Directors of the American Menopause
35 Foundation.
