
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE STATE OF HAWAII TO CONSIDER THE MERITS OF
RECOGNIZING HYPNOTHERAPY AS A LEGITIMATE PROFESSION AND
HYPNOTHERAPISTS AS PROVIDERS OF HUMAN SERVICES SEPARATE AND
INDEPENDENT FROM OTHER MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONS.

1 WHEREAS, hypnotherapy is a recognized helping profession;
2 and

4 WHEREAS, health care professionals who are knowledgeable
5 about hypnotherapy say that it is a therapeutic tool used to
6 facilitate psychotherapeutic treatment of a wide range of
7 disorders; and

9 WHEREAS, according to these professionals, the Dictionary
10 of Occupational Titles for the United States Department of Labor
11 lists hypnotherapy as a profession, separate and independent
12 from psychiatry and psychology; and

14 WHEREAS, another statistic cited by these professionals is
15 that in 1989, the National Center of Education Statistics of the
16 United States Department of Education assigned a Classification
17 of Instructional Programs number to hypnotherapy, CIP 51.2303,
18 subsequently changed to CIP 51.3603, under the Health
19 Professions and Related Sciences category; now, therefore,

21 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-third
22 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2006, the
23 House of Representatives concurring, that the State of Hawaii is
24 requested to consider the merits of recognizing hypnotherapy as
25 a legitimate profession and hypnotherapists as providers of
26 human services separate and independent from other mental health
27 professions, including psychiatry and psychology; and

29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
30 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the
31 Director of Health, the Director of Human Services, the Director



1 of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, and the Director of Labor and
3 Industrial Relations.
