
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS TO SUPPORT AND
ADVOCATE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND FUNDING OF COMMUNITY AND
YOUTH CENTERS IN HAWAIIAN HOMESTEAD COMMUNITIES WITH
PRIVATE, COUNTY, STATE, AND FEDERAL FUNDING.

1 WHEREAS, the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act of 1920, as
2 amended (Hawaiian Homes Commission Act), provides for the
3 rehabilitation of Hawaiian people with fifty per cent or more
4 Hawaiian blood; and

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6 WHEREAS, the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act provided 209,000
7 acres of dedicated land to achieve the intent of the Act; and

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9 WHEREAS, while the United States Congress has oversight of
10 the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, the administration and daily
11 operations of the program are managed by the State of Hawaii
12 Department of Hawaiian Home Lands and its nine-member
13 commission; and

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15 WHEREAS, the emphasis in the early years of the program was
16 to rehabilitate native Hawaiian beneficiaries of the Hawaiian
17 Homes Commission Act by awarding leases to parcels of land for
18 residential, agricultural, and pastoral purposes; and

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20 WHEREAS, the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands has awarded
21 over seven thousand residential leases to native Hawaiians since
22 the beginning of the program; and

24 WHEREAS, the intent of the author of the Hawaiian Homes
25 Commission Act, Prince Jonah Kuhio Kalaniana'ole, was to not only
26 return the native Hawaiians to the land from which they had been
27 alienated, but to help provide the means whereby the Hawaiian
28 ohana, in the largest sense of the word--the ohana of family and
29 community--could come together and thus begin the healing of a
30 people; and

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1 WHEREAS, a "piko", or center, or a place in the community
2 is vital to that reconnection; and
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
4 WHEREAS, a majority of existing homestead communities lack
5 a center that can provide the impetus for families to gather, to
6 celebrate, to commemorate, to support, and to further build a
7 capacity for self-determination and self-governance; now,
8 therefore,

10 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-third
11 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2006, the
12 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of
13 Hawaiian Home Lands is requested to support the development and
14 funding of community and youth centers in Hawaiian homestead
15 communities with private, county, state, and federal funding;
16 and
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18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Hawaiian Home
19 Lands is urged to assist and partner with Homestead Community
20 Associations in securing land, funds, and resources to build
21 these community centers designed to fit the vision and needs of
22 the particular community; and

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
25 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the
26 United States, the President of the United States Senate, the
27 Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, each
28 member of Hawaii's congressional delegation, the Secretary of
29 the Interior, the Chairperson of the Hawaiian Homes Commission,
30 the Commissioners of the Hawaiian Homes Commission, and the
31 Governor of the State of Hawaii.
