SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO FORM
A TASK FORCE TO RECOMMEND SOLUTIONS TO ABATE AND PREVENT
THE ACCUMULATION OF SEDIMENT IN WAILOA RIVER AND HILO BAY.

1 WHEREAS, there are five natural bodies of water that
2 discharge into the Hilo Bay: Wailoa River, Wailuku River,
3 Pukihae Stream, Pohakaunanaka Stream, and Maili Stream; and
4

5 WHEREAS, these rivers and their tributaries originate on
6 the slopes of Mauna Kea and Mauna Loa, and drain forests,
7 pasture and range land, agricultural fields, and urban areas;
8 and
9

10 WHEREAS, the Wailoa River discharges into Hilo Bay and is
11 one of the major sources of sediment into Hilo Bay; and
12

13 WHEREAS, the prevailing winds along Wailoa River and the
14 stagnation of water in places of the river encourage the growth
15 of phytoplankton; and
16

17 WHEREAS, the movement of water of the Wailoa River is
18 generally insufficient to flush out silt and mud; and
19

20 WHEREAS, the sediment accumulation in the Wailoa River
21 eventually deposits into the Hilo Bay which causes water
22 pollution of the bay and is a public health hazard; and

24 WHEREAS, it has been reported that State monitoring of
25 water for Hilo Bay in the past showed frequent violations of
26 water quality standards for nitrogen, phosphorus, and turbidity;

29 WHEREAS, there are exceptionally high levels of arsenic in
30 sediments in Hilo Bay and other contaminants found in Hilo Bay
31 include lead, zinc, chromium, chlordane residues, and harmful
32 agricultural chemicals; and

1 WHEREAS, Wailoa River and Hilo Bay are subject to chronic
2 nonpoint source sewage pollution with high bacterial counts; and
3

4 WHEREAS, Wailoa River and Hilo Bay are important wildlife
5 and fishery areas and are highly visible to residents and
6 tourists; now, therefore,
7

8 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-third
9 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2006, the
10 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Land
11 and Natural Resources is requested to form a Wailoa River and
12 Hilo Bay sedimentary abatement task force to recommend solutions
13 to sedimentation; and

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force be composed of
16 the following members:
17

- 18 (1) Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources
19 or designee, as chair;
- 20
- 21 (2) Director of Transportation or designee;
22
- 23 (3) Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture, or designee;
24
- 25 (4) Director of Health, or designee;
26
- 27 (5) Mayor of Hawaii County, or designee;
28
- 29 (6) Representative of an environmental protection advocacy
30 organization, as selected by the Chairperson of the
31 Board of Land and Natural Resources;

- 33 (7) Representative of a Big Island farm organization, as
34 selected by the Chairperson of the Board of
35 Agriculture;

- 37 (8) Representative of recreational boaters, to be selected
38 by the Director of Transportation;

- 40 (9) Representative of commercial boaters, to be selected
41 by the Director of Transportation; and

- 43 (10) Representative of canoe clubs, to be selected by the
44 Mayor of Hawaii County.

3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force report its
4 findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than
5 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of
6 2007; and

8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
9 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
10 Board of Land and Natural Resources, Director of Transportation,
11 Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture, Director of Health, and
12 Mayor of Hawaii County.
