SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE OF HAWAII TO CONVENE A GROUP OF INTERESTED STAKEHOLDERS TO INVESTIGATE AND RECOMMEND WAYS THAT HAWAI`I CAN ACHIEVE GREATER ECONOMIC INDEPENDENCE.

1 WHEREAS, Hawai`i is the most remote, inhabited island chain
2 in the world; and

3
4 WHEREAS, it is over two thousand miles from California,
5 over three thousand miles from Japan, over four thousand miles
6 from China, and over five thousand miles from the Philippines;
7 and

9 WHEREAS, Hawai`i depends on commercial maritime imports for
10 an estimated eighty percent of its consumer goods; and

11
12 WHEREAS, Hawai`i depends on imported oil for over
13 ninety-two percent of its energy needs; and

14
15 WHEREAS, no other state relies as heavily on oil for its
16 energy needs as Hawai`i; and

18 WHEREAS, Hawai`i's isolation and reliance on imported
19 consumer products and oil make its economy extremely susceptible
20 to outside forces; and

22 WHEREAS, an oil supply disruption would effect every aspect
23 of our way of life by impacting critical necessities such as the
24 delivery of health care and the food supply; and

25
26 WHEREAS, Hawai`i's remote geographic location makes timely
27 emergency deliveries of petroleum reserves difficult; and

28
29 WHEREAS, for many of Hawai`i's residents, quality of life
30 issues are also impacted by the State's ongoing dependence on
31 other outside resources; and

1 WHEREAS, this exemplifies why it is essential for the sake
2 of Hawai'i's security to take action to help Hawai'i achieve
3 greater economic independence; and

5 WHEREAS, one way to achieve greater economic independence
6 is to reduce our dependence on fossil fuels by encouraging
7 alternative energy production; and
8

9 WHEREAS, Hawai'i has yet to fully realize certain
10 indigenous resources such as biomass, hydroelectric power, wave
11 energy, solar and wind power, that it can utilize for energy
12 production; and


14 WHEREAS, sustainable agriculture has been an ongoing,
15 expanding industry in Hawai'i for the last fifty years; and

17 WHEREAS, multiple avenues for economic independence can and
18 should be studied and pursued; now, therefore,


20 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-third
21 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2006, the
22 House of Representatives concurring, that the Chamber of
23 Commerce of Hawaii is requested to convene a group of interested
24 stakeholders, including individuals from the business and
25 private sectors, to investigate and recommend ways that Hawai'i
26 can achieve greater economic independence; and

28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chamber of Commerce of
29 Hawaii is requested to submit a report, including any proposed
30 legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior
31 to the convening of Regular Session of 2007; and

33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
34 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the
35 Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii.
