# SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS TO  
AUTHORIZE THE STATE FIRE COUNCIL TO EMPLOY AN ADMINISTRATOR  
AND AN ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT.

1           WHEREAS, Section 132-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes,  
2 establishes the State Fire Council, which consists of the fire  
3 chiefs of the counties; and  
4

5           WHEREAS, the functions of the state fire council is to  
6 adopt the state fire code, and to coordinate applications to the  
7 federal government for federal grant assistance for fire-related  
8 projects and to administer those grants; and  
9

10           WHEREAS, the state fire council also undertakes myriad  
11 other fire-prevention duties, including fire inspection and  
12 prevention; and  
13

14           WHEREAS, the State Fire Council is administratively  
15 attached to the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations;  
16 and

18           WHEREAS, current law does not provide for an administrator  
19 for the State Fire Council; and  
20

21           WHEREAS, the State Fire Council has difficulty in  
22 performing its functions which have been assumed by county fire  
23 departments instead, but this has caused county fire departments  
24 to lose the use of personnel who perform the duties of the  
25 Council; and  
26

27           WHEREAS, an administrator is needed to assist the council  
28 with its operations to enhance the effectiveness and efficiency  
29 of the State Fire Council; now, therefore,

31           BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-third  
32 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2006, the  
33 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of

1 Labor and Industrial Relations is requested to authorize the  
2 creation of positions for an administrator and an administrative  
3 assistant for the State Fire Council; and

7 and Industrial Relations, the State Fire Council, and the Fire  
8 Chief of each county.
