
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DIRECTOR OF HEALTH TO CONDUCT A PREVENTION AND
EDUCATION CAMPAIGN ON THE INCREASING INCIDENCE OF BEDBUGS.

1 WHEREAS, after nearly being eradicated six decades ago,
2 bedbugs are appearing in growing numbers throughout the United
3 States; and

4
5 WHEREAS, the National Pest Management Association indicates
6 they have received reports of bedbugs in forty-three states; and

7
8 WHEREAS, changing pest control practices that favor non-
9 toxic alternatives is believed to have contributed to the
10 current bedbug problem; and

11
12 WHEREAS, increased world travel has also been a factor in
13 the re-emergence of bedbugs, which are easily transported in a
14 suitcase and can survive for long periods without food; and

15
16 WHEREAS, nationally, a number of hotels with bedbug
17 problems have had to deal with frustrated visitors and negative
18 publicity; and

19
20 WHEREAS, Hawaii's visitor industry and residents alike are
21 susceptible to the increasing incidence of bedbugs and the
22 exorbitant costs related to their control and extermination;
23 now, therefore,

25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-third
26 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2006, the
27 House of Representatives concurring, that the Director of Health
28 is requested to conduct a prevention and education campaign on
29 the increasing incidence of bedbugs; and

31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health is
32 requested to submit findings and recommendations to the

1 Legislature not later than twenty days prior to the convening of
2 the Regular Session of 2007; and

3
4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
5 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health.
