Your Committee on Human Services, to which was referred H.R. No. 13 entitled:

"HOUSE RESOLUTION URGING THE HAWAII YOUTH CORRECTIONAL FACILITY TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE FEASIBILITY OF PROVIDING A CONTINUUM OF ALCOHOL, SUBSTANCE ABUSE, SEX OFFENDER, SEX ABUSE VICTIM, AND MEDICAL AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES FOR INCARCERATED YOUTH,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose of this resolution is to prompt the Hawaii Youth Correctional Facility (HYCF) to conduct a feasibility study into expanding the scope and spectrum of care programs for incarcerated youths at the facility, specifically in the areas of:

- (1) Alcohol and substance abuse;
- (2) Sex offender rehabilitation;
- (3) Sex victim rehabilitation and treatment;
- (4) Medical health; and
- (5) Mental health care.

The Hawaii Youth Services Network and a concerned citizen testified in support of this measure. Office of Youth Services supported the intent.
