MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR DENTAL HEALTH.

Appropriates funds for community-based dental health clinics that are operated by community health centers or other community-based organizations to assist and improve the dental-health of QUEST eligible adults and children, the aged, blind, and disabled population. (HB3259 HD1)

Amends Act 239, SLH 2005, by prohibiting DHS from restricting a physician's ability to treat a fee-for-service mental health consumer with psychotropic medications that have been approved by the FDA and are considered appropriate within the scope of the physician's practice for the treatment of a mental health consumer. Repeals the pre-authorization exemption for psychotropic medication and the requirement that DHS report on the cost and effects of the Act. (HB3105 HD2)


