Re: Senate Bill 1931 SD2 HD3 CD2

On July 10, 2007, Senate Bill 1931, entitled "A Bill for an Act Relating to Education" became law without my signature, pursuant to Section 16 of Article III of the State Constitution.

Senate Bill 1931 establishes a working group administered by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations to analyze if workforce development needs are being met by the public schools, and to report to the 2008 Legislative session. Additionally, the University of Hawaii and the Department of Education are required to submit specific reports to the 2008 Legislature on workforce development. The bill appropriates \$200,000 in general funds to the Department of Education and the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations.

The major concern with this bill is that it is redundant with existing programs in the Department of Education and the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations.

The Work Force Development Councils, established in 1998, and attached to the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, already are tasked with identifying and implementing ways in which our educational system can meet the needs of our workforce. Additionally, this function is also a part of the wider mission of the P-20 Initiative that began in 1993.

This bill contains an appropriation totaling \$175,000 for the two-year biennium to the Department of Education to fund three new staff positions. The Department of Education has stated that the resources are insufficient for it to carry out the functions of this bill.

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For the foregoing reasons, I allowed Senate Bill 1931 to become law as Act 283, effective July 10, 2007, without my signature.

# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	EDUCATIONAL WORKFORCE WORKING GROUP
3	SECTION 1. (a) There is established an educational
4	workforce working group within the department of labor and
5	industrial relations for administrative purposes only. The
6	chairperson of the workforce development council or the
7	chairperson's designee shall convene the first meeting of the
8	educational workforce working group no later than August 1,
9	2007, at which time the members shall select a chair, to examine
10	and address the following issues:
11	(1) How well the workforce needs of Hawaii are currently
12	being met;
13	(2) How prepared the State is to meet the workforce needs
14	of the future;
15	(3) What recommendations can be made to improve Hawaii's
16	educational system to fulfill the workforce needs of
17	the future;

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What is the current relationship between the public 1 (4)schools and emerging industries: 2 What percentage of high school students participate in 3 (5) any form of vocational or professional training 4 outside of the school setting; 5 What aspects of high school curriculum, standards, and (6)6 7 assessment strategies have a direct relationship to the State's future workforce needs: 8 What are the challenges or impediments to creating a 9 (7) more direct relationship between schools and economy-10 11 driving industries of the State; 12 How might autonomous schools-within-schools, magnet (8) schools, specialized schools, and charter schools be 13 better used to create more direct links between high 14 schools and economy-driving industries of the State; 15 and 16 How might the size of public schools, the distribution (9) 17 of discretionary funding, the decentralized authority 18 of school community councils or charter school local 19

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school boards, and other organizational reforms be 20 better used to satisfy the workforce development needs 21 of the information and technology age. 22

4	proposed	legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty

6	(c)	The membership of the educational workforce working
7	group sha	all be as follows:
8	(1)	Two representatives appointed by the president of the
9		senate;
10	(2)	Two representatives appointed by the speaker of the
11	· ·	house of representatives;
12	(3)	The director of business, economic development, and
13		tourism or the director's designee;
14	(4)	The superintendent of education or the
15		superintendent's designee;
16	(5)	Two representatives from the University of Hawaii
17		system; provided that at least one shall be the
18		chancellor of a community college;
19	(6)	Two high school principals appointed by the
20		superintendent of education from the high school
21		principals leadership group;

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1	(7)	The executive director of the Hawaii P-20 council or
2		the executive director's designee;
3	(8)	The chairperson of the workforce development council
4		or the chairperson's designee;
5	(9)	The president and chief executive officer of
6		Enterprise Honolulu or the president and chief
7		executive officer's designee;
8	(10)	The president of the Hawaii Science and Technology
9		Council or the president's designee;
10	(11)	The president and chief executive officer of the
11		Hawaii Community Foundation or the president and chief
12		executive officer's designee; and
13	(12)	The executive director of the Honolulu Community
14		Action Program or the executive director's designee.
15	SECT	ION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
16	revenues o	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$25,000 or so much
17	thereof as	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 for the
18	educationa	al workforce working group.
19	The s	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of

labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this part.

2	EDUCATING HAWAII'S WORKFORCE		
3	SECTION 3. The department of education shall include		
4	within its strategic plan, plans to ensure optimal use of		
5	technology for administration, data collection, and data sharing		
6	related to educational and workforce needs, and plans to ensure		
7	that personalized student education plans will provide a direct		
8	link to economic and workforce needs.		
9	The department of education shall submit a report		
10	containing its five-year plan to the legislature no later than		
11	twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of		
12	2008.		
13	SECTION 4. The University of Hawaii shall prepare a report		
14	detailing:		
15	(1) The current activities on each of its campuses to		
16	prepare students with the skills and knowledge needed		
17	to successfully enter and progress in the Hawaii		
18	workforce;		
19	(2) The University of Hawaii's current plans to increase		
20	the percentage of Hawaii high school graduates who		
21	continue their education by enrolling at a University		
22	of Hawaii campus and to increase the percentage of		
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students who earn degrees or certificates within one
hundred fifty per cent of the planned length of the
degree, particularly in fields where the State is
experiencing shortages of qualified employees; and
(3) Recommendations about additional steps the State needs
to consider implementing to increase the number of
qualified workers in the State.

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8 The University of Hawaii shall submit the report to the 9 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 10 the regular session of 2008.

SECTION 5. (a) There is appropriated out of the general 11 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$125,000 or so much 12 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the 13 sum of \$50,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 14 vear 2008-2009 for 2.0 (FTE) workforce development liaison 15 positions and 1.0 (FTE) support staff position within the 16 department of education to assist the department of education in 17 coordinating workforce development efforts with the various 18 departments, agencies, businesses, and organizations, including 19 the University of Hawaii and public school academies, within the 20 State to provide students with: 21

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1	(2)	Access to unpaid and paid internships and experiential	
2		learning opportunities; and	
3	(3)	Job placement assistance;	
4	provided t	that the duties of the workforce development liaisons	
5	shall be d	livided into public sector and private sector	
6	relations	nips. The public sector liaison shall be responsible	
7	for coordinating workforce development efforts between the		
8	department of education and any department or agency of the		
9	State, the	e counties, or any political subdivisions thereof, and	
10 <sup>°</sup>	the privat	e sector liaison shall be responsible for coordinating	
11	workforce	development efforts between the department of	
12	education	and businesses, nonprofit organizations, and other	
13	private se	ctor organizations.	
14	(b)	The workforce development liaisons shall also be	
15	responsibl	e for:	
16	(1)	Identifying future workforce need areas, such as	
17		nursing, teaching, science and technology, and

21	(3)	Interfacing with the business community to determine

4		opportunities; and
5	(4)	Assisting the public schools and the academies with
6		curriculum integration and other department of
7		education functions.
8	The	sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
9	of educat	ion for the purposes of this part.
10	SECT	ION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
