# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS AT THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The Senator Hiram L. Fong commission established by the legislature through Act 117, Session Laws of 2 3 Hawaii 2005, found that Senator Fong's public service of over 4 thirty years was distinguished by his ability to bridge partisan 5 and ethnic lines. Senator Fong championed civil rights, labor rights, and immigration reform. He helped pass the Little Wager 6 7 Act, which gave Hawaii's agricultural workers who were not covered under the federal Wagner Act, the right to unionize. 8 9 Senator Fong was also a firm believer in the free market and the 10 virtues of personal responsibility and self-reliance.

11 The commission also found that Senator Fong's legislative 12 accomplishments were the result of collaboration and cooperation 13 from his democratic colleagues, particularly Hawaii's other 14 United States senator, Oren E. Long, and United States Senate 15 majority leader, Lyndon Johnson. Federal legislation to 16 establish the East-West Center was introduced by Senator Oren E.

Long and its ultimate success is due in large part to his and
 Senator Hiram L. Fong's leadership and collaboration.

The commission recommended that the legislature establish the Senator Hiram L. Fong scholarship at the University of Hawaii. The commission also suggested that Senator Oren E. Long be honored for his forty-one years of public service, which included service as superintendent of public instruction for twelve years, secretary of the territory of Hawaii, governor of Hawaii, and United States Senator.

10 The purpose of this Act is to establish two scholarship 11 programs--one in honor of Senator Hiram L. Fong and the other in 12 honor of Senator Oren E. Long--to be administered by the 13 University of Hawaii, with proceeds from endowment trusts that 14 shall receive initial funding by appropriations out of the 15 general revenues of the State.

16 The legislature finds and declares that the appropriations 17 under this Act are in the best interest of the public in helping 18 to provide public higher education assistance opportunities.

SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately
designated and to read as follows:

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

3 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000 or so much 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 for the 6 University of Hawaii to establish an endowment trust with an 7 appropriate financial institution, the proceeds from which shall 8 fund the Senator Oren E. Long scholarship; provided that the 9 University of Hawaii shall administer the scholarship.

10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of11 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

12 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.

13 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
