## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PEDESTRIANS' RIGHT OF WAY.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 291C-72, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "\$291C-72 Pedestrians' right of way in crosswalks. 4 The driver of a vehicle shall stop [and yield the right of way, 5 to for a pedestrian who is crossing the roadway within a 6 crosswalk when the pedestrian is [upon] either: 7 (1)Upon the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is 8 traveling[7]; or [when the pedestrian is approaching] 9 (2) Approaching the vehicle so closely from the opposite 10 half of the roadway as to be in danger [-], 11 and shall not proceed until the pedestrian has passed the 12 vehicle and the driver can safely proceed.
- (b) No pedestrian shall suddenly leave a curb or other
  place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle which
  is so close that it is impossible for the driver to yield.
- 16 (c) Subsection (a) shall not apply under the conditions 17 stated in section 291C-73(b).

5	"[+]\$291C-73[+] Crossing at other than crosswalks. (a)		
6	Every pedestrian crossing a roadway at any point other than		
7	within a marked crosswalk or within an unmarked crosswalk at an		
8	intersection shall yield the right of way to all vehicles upon		
9	the roadway.		
10	(b) Any pedestrian crossing a roadway at a point where a		
11	pedestrian tunnel or overhead pedestrian crossing has been		
12	provided shall yield the right of way to all vehicles upon the		
13	roadway.		
14	(c) Between adjacent intersections at which traffic-		
15	control signals are in operation, pedestrians shall not cross at		
16	any place except in a marked crosswalk.		
17	(d) No pedestrian shall cross a roadway intersection		
18	diagonally unless authorized by official traffic-control		
19	devices; and, when authorized to cross diagonally, pedestrians		
20	shall cross only in accordance with the official traffic-control		
21	devices pertaining to [such] the crossing movements.

- 3 SECTION 3. Section 291C-161, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 5 "(c) Every person convicted [of violating] under or found
- in violation of section 291C-12, 291C-12.5, 291C-12.6, 291C-72, 6
- 291C-73, 291C-95, or 291C-105 shall be sentenced or fined in 7
- 8 accordance with those sections."
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 10 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 11 begun, before its effective date.
- 12 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
