## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEACHER LICENSING.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's public

2 schools would be well served if there were an abundance of

3 highly qualified teachers from which public school principals

4 could select.

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5 SECTION 2. Section 302A-802, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

6 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

7 "(c) The board shall adopt policies, exempt from chapters

91 and 92, to initiate the following:

(1) Develop criteria allowing more individuals with trade

or industry experience to teach in vocational,

11 technical, and career pathway programs, and criteria

for the issuance of permits allowing qualified

individuals to teach when recommended by the

14 superintendent. The department shall be responsible

for the review and acceptance of the relevant

16 licenses, certificates, or other qualifications

related to an individual's vocational, technical, or

18 career pathway education-related experience that the

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Ţ		department deems necessary for a permit. The
2		department shall have the authority to waive the
3		requirement of a bachelor's degree to teach in a
4		vocation, technical, or career pathway education
5		program;
6	(2)	Develop a plan to accept teachers from any state as
7		long as they have completed state-approved teacher
8		education programs and pass relevant Hawaii teacher
9		examinations or their equivalent;
10	(3)	Clarify the requirements, on a state-by-state basis,
11		for out-of-state licensed teachers to obtain a license
12		in Hawaii;
13	(4)	Develop a plan to facilitate licensing for those who
14		intend to teach in Hawaii immersion programs, the
15		island of Niihau, or any other extraordinary situation
16		as defined by the superintendent or the
17		superintendent's designee; [and]
18	(5)	Pursue full teacher license reciprocity with [the
19		mid Atlantic states, California, Colorado, Illinois,
20		Michigan, New York, Oregon, and Washington.] all other
21		states; and

1	(6)	Issue a license to a teacher with a valid out-of-state
2		license who has passed similar, though not identical,
3		tests in basic skills, pedagogy, and subject matter to
4		those required for licensure in the State; provided
5		that upon the effective date of the adoption of
6		administrative rules addressing the recognition of
7		out-of-state teacher licenses, those administrative
8		rules shall supersede the requirements of this
9		paragraph."
10	SECT	ION 3. The Hawaii teacher standards board shall
11	provide notification to the chairs of the senate committee on	
12	education and the house of representatives committee on	
13	education upon the adoption of the administrative rules relating	
14	to the issuance of licenses to teachers with valid out-of-state	
15	licenses who have passed similar, though not identical, tests in	
16	basic skills, pedagogy, and subject matter to those required for	
17	licensure in the State.	
18	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed	
19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.	
20	SECTI	ON 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
