A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST SEAWATER AIR CONDITIONING PROJECTS ON THE ISLAND OF OAHU.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that support for the
 development of renewable energy systems and efficient energy
 systems in the State, which is geographically isolated from
 sources of oil, continues to be in the public interest.

The legislature further finds that Honolulu Seawater Air 5 6 Conditioning LLC proposes to build seawater air conditioning 7 district cooling systems on the island of Oahu. Honolulu Seawater Air Conditioning LLC is engaged in the planning, 8 9 design, and construction of a seawater air conditioning district 10 cooling facility and chilled water distribution system in 11 downtown Honolulu using cold, deep seawater as the primary 12 cooling source.

13 The legislature finds and declares that the issuance of 14 special purpose revenue bonds under this Act is in the public 15 interest and for the public health, safety, and general welfare. 16 The legislature further finds that the issuance of special

1 (6) Have lower operating and maintenance costs than individual building air conditioning systems; 2 3 (7) Eliminate the need for up to 0.63 kilowatts of 4 electricity generation capacity for each ton of 5 cooling capacity; 6 (8) Will generate millions of dollars in construction 7 project spending. In addition to construction jobs, a 8 significant number of long-term, well-paid jobs will 9 also be created. Other local economic development 10 benefits will accrue from money that stays in Hawaii, 11 and is not used to purchase oil; and (9) 12 Will help the State of Hawaii, the city and county of 13 Honolulu, and the federal government to meet goals and 14 mandates for energy efficiency and renewable energy 15 use. 16 SECTION 2. Pursuant to part V, chapter 39A, Hawaii Revised 17 Statutes, the department of budget and finance, with the 18 approval of the governor, may issue special purpose revenue 19 bonds in a total amount not to exceed \$20,000,000, in one or 20 more series, for the purpose of assisting Honolulu Seawater Air

21 Conditioning LLC, in the design and construction of this

The legislature finds and determines that the activity and
 facilities of Honolulu Seawater Conditioning LLC constitute a
 project as defined in part V, chapter 39A, Hawaii Revised
 Statutes, and the financing thereof is assistance to an
 industrial enterprise.

6 SECTION 3. The special purpose revenue bonds and the
7 refunding special purpose revenue bonds issued under this Act
8 shall be issued pursuant to part V, chapter 39A, Hawaii Revised
9 Statutes, relating to the power to issue special purpose revenue
10 bonds to assist industrial enterprises.

11 SECTION 4. The department of budget and finance, from time to time, including times subsequent to June 30, 2012, may issue 12 13 special purpose revenue bonds in whatever principal amounts the 14 department determines to be necessary to refund the special 15 purpose revenue bonds authorized in section 2 and to refund special purpose revenue bonds authorized in this section, 16 17 regardless of whether the outstanding special purpose revenue bonds or refunding special purpose revenue bonds have matured or 18 19 are the subject of redemption.

In making this determination, the department shall complywith federal law relating to the exemption from federal income

1 taxation of the interest on bonds of the nature authorized by 2 this section.

3 SECTION 5. The authorization to issue special purpose
4 revenue bonds under this Act shall lapse on June 30, 2012.
5 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
