A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILDREN'S HEALTH CARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. Although estimates of the number of uninsured
3	children in the state vary, it is widely acknowledged that there
4	is a gap group that is ineligible for any state or federal
5	health care coverage. The majority of children in this gap
6	group are those whose family income is at or just over three
7	hundred per cent of the federal poverty level. Others in this
8	group may include infants born to uninsured mothers, immigrants
9	with temporary visas, and undocumented immigrants who have been
10	in Hawaii for less than six months. The total number of those
11	who fall into the gap group could be as high as three thousand
12	five hundred children.
13	A study performed by the Urban Institute, a nonpartisan
14	economic and social policy research organization, found that
15	regardless of age, race, ethnicity, income, or health status,
16	uninsured children were much less likely to have received a
17	well-child checkup within the past year and were more likely
18	than insured children to report an unmet need for medical care
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- 1 that was associated with concerns about cost. Children who lack
- 2 a source of care or regularly use a hospital emergency
- 3 department are unlikely to receive preventive care or early and
- 4 regular management of acute or chronic health conditions.
- 5 Local health care coverage providers offer children's plans
- 6 that cover certain preventive services, immunizations, doctor
- 7 visits, diagnostic tests, emergency care, mental health
- 8 benefits, and some prescription drugs.
- 9 The State has the opportunity to help provide health care
- 10 coverage for children in the gap group through partnerships with
- 11 mutual benefit societies such as the Hawaii Medical Service
- 12 Association. Such partnerships will allow the State to offer
- 13 coverage to uninsured children under the existing children's
- 14 plans offered by these mutual benefit societies. The cost of
- 15 the premium will be split equally between the partner managed
- 16 care plan and the State.
- 17 The purpose of this part is to ensure health care for all
- 18 of Hawaii's children by establishing the Hawaii children's
- 19 health care program as a temporary three-year pilot program to
- 20 provide health care coverage to uninsured children.
- 21 SECTION 2. Hawaii children's health care program. (a)
- 22 There is established the Hawaii children's health care program

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	1	as a temporary three-year pilot progr	ram to provide health c
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- 2 coverage to uninsured children. The pilot program shall provide
- 3 health care coverage through a public-private partnership,
- 4 established as a contract to provide health and human services
- 5 pursuant to chapter 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, between the
- 6 department of human services and a managed care plan operating
- 7 in the state under chapter 432, Hawaii Revised Statutes, that
- 8 offers accident and health or sickness insurance plans.
- 9 (b) To qualify for this pilot program, a child shall:
- 10 (1) Be between thirty-one days to eighteen years old;
- 11 (2) Have been uninsured continually for at least six

months; provided that infants between thirty-one days

and six months of age shall have been uninsured

14 continually since birth; and

(3) Have been ineligible during the six months the child

16 was uninsured for any other state or federal health

care coverage, and be currently ineligible for such

coverage; provided that all children enrolled in a

mutual benefit society's children's plan as of the

effective date of this Act shall be eligible for

enrollment into the Hawaii children's health care

program; provided further that children between

1	thirty-one days to eighteen years of age who become
2	ineligible for QUEST due to an increase in family
3	income may enroll in the Hawaii children's health care
1	program upon disensollment from OUEST

- (c) The department of human services and the managed care
 plan shall share equally in the cost of the premium for each
 child enrolled in the pilot program.
- 8 (d) The department of human services shall pay the State's
 9 share of the premiums under the pilot program on a quarterly
 10 basis.
- 11 (e) The managed care plan participating in the pilot
 12 program shall be responsible for determining the eligibility of
 13 Hawaii children's health care program applicants and of
 14 enrolling applicants in the pilot program.
- 15 (f) The managed care plan participating in the pilot
 16 program shall provide a quarterly report to the department of
 17 human services and the legislature on the number of children
 18 enrolled in the pilot program.
- (g) Other private organizations may partner with the State
 to offer coverage to uninsured children under the pilot program;
 provided that plan benefits to be provided shall be equal to or

- 1 better than those offered through the pilot program established
- 2 by the State and a managed care plan under subsection (a).
- 3 (h) The department of human services and any participating
- 4 managed care plan shall report to the legislature no later than
- 5 twenty days prior to the start of the 2008 and 2009 regular
- 6 sessions on:
- 7 (1) Any problems experienced with the program involving
- 8 crowding out eligible participants;
- 9 (2) Instances of people dropping their previous coverage
- 10 to receive this free coverage;
- 11 (3) The amount of funding used and for what purposes;
- 12 (4) Any other problems encountered in the administration
- of the program; and
- 14 (5) Any proposed legislation necessary to improve
- administration of the program.
- (i) The Hawaii children's health care program shall
- 17 terminate on June 30, 2010.
- 18 PART II
- 19 SECTION 3. The purpose of this part is to provide access
- 20 to medical care free-of-charge for children nineteen years of
- 21 age or younger whose family income is at or below three hundred
- 22 per cent of the federal poverty level.

- 11 eligibility. The department of human services shall provide
- 12 medical assistance under QUEST-Net at no charge to children
- 13 nineteen years or younger whose family income is at or above two
- 14 hundred fifty per cent and does not exceed three hundred per
- 15 cent of the federal poverty level for Hawaii and who are
- 16 otherwise eligible for QUEST-Net benefits.

- 18 SECTION 6. The purpose of this part is to provide
- 19 continuous, quality health care services to uninsured newborn
- 20 children between one and thirty-one days of age.

- 1 SECTION 7. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "\$346- Hawaii infant care special fund. (a) There is
- 5 established within the department the Hawaii infant care special
- 6 fund to provide continuous, quality health care services to
- 7 uninsured newborn children between one and thirty-one days of
- 8 age.
- 9 (b) The department shall administer the fund to provide up
- 10 to \$10,000 of health care assistance per eligible infant.
- 11 (c) The department shall seek out health care providers to
- 12 participate in a dollar-for-dollar matching-funds, public-
- 13 private partnership established through a contract to provide
- 14 health and human services pursuant to chapter 103F between the
- 15 department and private health care providers to continue to
- 16 provide health care services to children who require services
- 17 that exceed the \$10,000 threshold.
- 18 (d) The department or their designated contractor shall
- 19 directly reimburse any health care provider participating in the
- 20 dollar-for-dollar matching-funds, public-private partnership.
- 21 The department may contract with an appropriate entity to
- 22 provide these services.

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         SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the general
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    revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of $ or so much
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- 1 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 to
- 2 establish the Hawaii children's health care program as a
- 3 temporary three-year pilot program to provide health care
- 4 coverage to uninsured children.
- 5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 6 human services for the purposes of part I of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 to provide
- 10 QUEST-Net services free-of-charge to children nineteen years of
- 11 age or younger whose family income is at or above two hundred
- 12 fifty per cent, and under three hundred per cent of the federal
- 13 poverty level.
- 14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 15 human services for the purposes of part II of this Act.
- 16 SECTION 12. There is appropriated out of the general
- 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 to be
- 19 deposited into the Hawaii infant care special fund to provide
- 20 continuous, quality health care services to uninsured newborn
- 21 children between one and thirty-one days of age.

- 1 SECTION 13. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii infant
- 2 care special fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may
- 3 be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 to provide continuous,
- 4 quality health care services to uninsured newborn children
- 5 between one and thirty-one days of age.

Report Title:

Children's Health Care

Description:

Creates 3-year pilot program where Department of Human Services pays half the premiums health care provided by a managed care plan to uninsured children who are 31 days to 18 years old and ineligible for other state or federal health care coverage; Sunsets June 30, 2010. Provides children of families whose income is at or below 300% of the federal poverty level free medical care by expanding the State's QUEST-Net eligibility requirements. Establishes Hawaii Infant Care Special Fund to provide health care to infants from birth to thirty-one days of age through matching-fund, public-private partnership established by the Department of Health. Appropriates funds. (HB1008 HD2).
