### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY LAW.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to create a self-2 employment assistance program to provide unemployed individuals 3 assistance in starting their own businesses. Participation in 4 the self-employment assistance program shall be voluntary, as an 5 alternative to receiving regular unemployment insurance benefits. The self-employment assistance program will allow 6 7 eligible unemployed individuals to receive weekly unemployment 8 insurance benefits while working full-time towards starting 9 their own businesses, rather than seeking employment. 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 383, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and

12 to read as follows:

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### "PART . SELF-EMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

14 §383-A Definitions. As used in this part:

15 "Full-time basis" means devoting the specified amount of 16 time, as prescribed by the department, necessary for an 17 individual to establish a business and become self-employed.

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1	"Regular benefits" means benefits payable to an individual
2	under this chapter, including benefits payable to federal
3	civilian employees and to former members of the United States
4	armed forces pursuant to the Title 5 U.S.C. Chapter 85, other
5	than additional benefits, extended benefits, and extended
6	benefits for dislocated workers.
7	"Self-employment assistance activities" means activities
8	approved by the director in which an individual participates for
9	the purpose of establishing a business and becoming self-
10	employed, including but not limited to:
11	(1) Entrepreneurial training;
12	(2) Business counseling; and
13	(3) Technical assistance.
14	"Self-employment assistance allowance" means an allowance
15	payable, in lieu of regular benefits, funded by the unemployment
16	compensation fund to an individual who meets the requirements of
17	this part.
18	§383-B Self-employment assistance program. The department
19	shall establish a self-employment assistance program in
20	accordance with this part. Information on the self-employment
21	assistance program shall be made available to potential program
22	participants.

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1	§383-	C Self-employment assistance allowance; weekly	
2	amount; ma	aximum. (a) The weekly amount of the self-employment	
3	assistance	e allowance payable to an individual shall be equal to	
4	the weekly	v benefit amount for regular benefits otherwise payable	
5	under sect	ion 383-22. The self-employment assistance allowance	
6	shall also be payable to an individual at the same intervals and		
7	on the sam	ne terms and conditions as regular benefits, except as	
8	follows:		
9	(1)	The requirements of section 383-29(a), regarding being	
10		available for work, actively seeking week, and	
11		refusing to accept suitable work shall not be	
12		applicable to the individual;	
13	(2)	The requirements of section 383-23 regarding	
14		remuneration for services performed shall not be	
15		applicable to income earned from self-employment by	
16		the individual;	
17	(3)	The individual is considered unemployed for purposes	
18		of section 383-29; and	
19	(4)	If the individual fails to participate in self-	
20		employment assistance activities or fails to actively	
21		engage on a full-time basis in establishing a business	
22		and becoming self-employed the individual is	
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1		ineligible to receive the self-employment assistance	
2		allowance for each week in which the failure occurs.	
3	(b)	The sum of the self-employment assistance allowances	
4	paid unde	r this part and regular benefits paid under this	
5	chapter s	hall not exceed the maximum amount of benefits	
6	established under section 383-24.		
7	§383	-D Eligibility. (a) An individual shall be eligible	
8	to receiv	e a self-employment assistance allowance if the	
9	individua	1:	
10	(1)	Is eligible to receive regular benefits or would be	
11		eligible to receive regular benefits except for the	
12		requirements described in section 383-C(a);	
13	(2)	Is identified under section 383-92.5 as an individual	
14		likely to exhaust regular benefits;	
15	(3)	Has filed an application for participation in the	
16		self-employment assistance program within sixty days	
17		of filing an initial claim for regular benefits and	
18		furnished the department with any other information	
19		the director may prescribe;	
20	(4)	Has, at the time the application is filed, a balance	
21		of regular benefits equal to at least eighteen times	
22		the individual's weekly benefits amount and at least	

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1		eighteen weeks remaining in the individual's benefit
2		year;
3	(5)	Has been accepted into a program approved by the
4		director that will provide self-employment assistance
5		activities;
6	(6)	Is participating in self-employment assistance
7		activities;
8	(7)	Is actively engaged on a full-time basis in
9		establishing a business and becoming self-employed;
10	(8)	Has not previously participated in a self-employment
11		assistance program; and
12	(9)	Has filed a weekly claim for the self-employment
13		assistance allowance and provided any information the
14		director prescribes, including a log of self-
15		employment assistance activities.
16	(b)	An individual who has received a self-employment
17	assistanc	e allowance under this part and is terminated or
18	voluntari	ly leaves a self-employed assistance program may
19	receive,	if otherwise eligible, regular benefits with respect to
20	the benef	it year; provided that the sum of regular benefits paid
21	and self-	employment assistance allowances paid with respect to

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the benefit year shall not exceed the maximum amount payable for 1 2 the benefit year under section 383-24. §383-E Limitation. The total number of individuals 3 4 receiving a self-employment assistance allowance at any time 5 shall not exceed five per cent of the total number of individuals receiving regular benefits at that time. 6 7 §383-F Costs. Any self-employment assistance allowance 8 paid under this part shall be charged to employers as regular 9 benefits in accordance with section 383-61. §383-G Rules. The director may adopt rules in accordance 10 with chapter 91 to carry out the purposes of this Act. 11 §383-H Reports. The department shall report annually to 12 the legislature on the self-employment assistance program at 13 least twenty days prior to the convening of each regular 14 The reports shall include the following: 15 session. 16 (1)The number of individuals participating in the selfemployment assistance program and the number of 17 businesses developed thereunder; 18 The cost of operating the program, compliance with 19 (2) program requirements, and data related to business 20 21 income;



1	(3)	The number of employees and wages paid in the new
2		businesses;
3	(4)	The incidence and duration of unemployment after
4		business start-up; and
5	(5)	Any recommendations, including proposed legislation,
6		on changes to the program.
7	§383-	-I Applicability. This part shall be effective for
8	the weeks	beginning after the date of enactment or after any
9	plan requ	ired by the United States Department of Labor is
10	approved,	whichever date is later. This part shall terminate as
11	of the ef:	fective date of the withdrawal of approval of any plan
12	required 1	by the United States Department of Labor or as of the
13	week conta	aining the date when federal law no longer authorizes
14	self-emplo	oyment assistance programs."
15	SECT	ION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section
16	2 of this	Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
17	appropria	te section numbers for the letters used in designating

- 18 the new sections in this Act.
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SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
