A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the cost of living 2 in Hawaii has been and continues to be high. A significant contributing factor to the high cost of living in Hawaii is the 3 4 high cost of housing, and it is the high cost of land that 5 contributes significantly to the high cost of housing. Land, in common with other natural resources, is a finite resource, a 6 7 fact particularly obvious in Hawaii. The shortage in the supply 8 of land leads to higher land prices and housing costs and 9 creates a situation in which land is developed for higher-priced 10 housing rather than affordable housing, which has led to the 11 housing crisis the state currently faces. As a result, there is 12 a current lack of desperately needed affordable housing.

13 The urgency of the affordable housing shortage in Hawaii 14 requires immediate state action. A 2003 housing policy study 15 indicated that there will continue to be a need for affordable 16 housing units over the next five years. However, Hawaii's low-17 and moderate-income families are experiencing difficulties in



1	entering the housing market with housing prices at an all-time
2	high.
3	The purpose of this Act is to increase the number of
4	affordable housing units in Honolulu's urban core, specifically
5	the Kakaako development area.
6	SECTION 2. Chapter 206E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by adding three new sections to part II to be
8	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
9	"§206E-A Kakaako affordable housing development program
10	established; purpose. (a) There is established the Kakaako
11	affordable housing development program within the authority to
12	provide affordable housing in the Kakaako community development
13	district established pursuant to section 206E-32.
14	(b) The purpose of this program shall be to create and
15	preserve in perpetuity affordable housing units within
16	Honolulu's urban core; provided that funds administered through
17	this program shall not be used for residential development in
18	the area described in section 206E-31.5.
19	§206E-B Kakaako affordable housing development fund. (a)
20	There is established the Kakaako affordable housing development
21	fund. Funds appropriated and all moneys received or collected



1	by the authority for the purpose of the fund shall be deposited			
2	in the fund.			
3	(b)	The proceeds in the fund shall be used:		
4	(1)	To provide subsidies and other assistance to eligible		
5		projects under section 206E-C;		
6	(2)	To reimburse the general fund to pay the interest on		
7		general obligation bonds issued for the purposes of		
8		the fund; and		
9	(3)	For the necessary expenses in administering the		
10		Kakaako affordable housing development program.		
11	<u>§206</u>	E-C Eligible projects. (a) For the purposes of this		
12	section,	activities eligible for subsidies and other assistance		
13	from the	Kakaako affordable housing development fund shall		
14	include new construction, rehabilitation, acquisition, or			
15	preservation of multifamily ownership housing units for persons			
16	and families with incomes at or below one hundred forty per cent			
17	of the median family income, as determined by the United States			
18	Department of Housing and Urban Development, that meet the			
19	<u>criteria</u>	for eligibility described in subsection (b) and are		
20	dedicated to affordable housing projects in perpetuity.			
21	(b)	The authority shall establish procedures for the		
22	submissio	n of requests for subsidies and other assistance and		



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1	criteria for assistance that are consistent with and further the		
2	purpose o	f section 206E-A for projects that:	
3	(1)	Are at least four stories or higher;	
4	(2)	Dedicate at least fifty per cent of their units to	
5		persons and families with incomes at or below one	
6		hundred forty per cent of the median family income as	
7		determined by the United States Department of Housing	
8		and Urban Development;	
9	(3)	Dedicate at least half of the units as provided in	
10		paragraph (2) to persons and families with incomes at	
11		or below eighty per cent of the median family income	
12		as determined by the United States Department of	
13		Housing and Urban Development; and	
14	(4)	Are located outside the area described in section	
15		<u>206E-31.5.</u>	
16	The	authority by rule may include other criteria for	
17	assistanc	e as it deems necessary to carry out the purposes of	
18	this sect	ion.	
19	(C)	The subsidies and other assistance provided by the	
20	authority	shall be limited to:	
21	(1)	\$75 per square foot for up to eight hundred square	
22	<u></u>	feet per unit; and	

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(2) No more than one thousand units in the aggregate." 1 2 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 3 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the same sum for fiscal year 2008-2009 4 5 to be deposited to the Kakaako affordable housing development 6 fund for the purposes of section 2. 7 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the Kakaako affordable housing development fund the sum of \$ 8 or so 9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and 10 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 11 year 2008-2009 for the purposes of section 2. 12 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii 13 community development authority for the purposes of this Act. 14 SECTION 5. Any funds remaining in the Kakaako affordable housing development fund on June 30, 2012, shall be returned to 15 16 the general fund. 17 SECTION 6. In codifying the new sections added by section 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute 18 19 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating 20 the new sections in this Act.

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- 1 SECTION 7. New statutory material is underscored.
- 2 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007, and
- 3 shall be repealed on June 30, 2012.
