### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the cost of living 1 in Hawaii has been and continues to be high. A significant 2 contributing factor to the high cost of living in Hawaii is the 3 high cost of housing, and it is the high cost of land that 4 contributes significantly to the high cost of housing. Land, in 5 common with other natural resources, is a finite resource, a 6 fact particularly obvious in Hawaii. The shortage in the supply 7 of land leads to higher land prices and housing costs and 8 creates a situation in which land is developed for higher-priced 9 housing rather than affordable housing, which has led to the 10 housing crisis the State currently faces. As a result, there is 11 a current lack of desperately needed affordable housing. 12 The urgency of the affordable housing shortage in Hawaii 13 requires immediate state action. A 2003 housing policy study 14 indicated that there will continue to be a need for affordable 15 housing units over the next five years. However, Hawaii's low-16 and moderate-income families are experiencing difficulties in 17

- 1 entering the housing market with housing prices at an all-time
- 2 high.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to increase the number of
- 4 affordable housing units in Honolulu's urban core, specifically
- 5 the Kakaako development area.
- 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 206E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended by adding three new sections to part II to be
- 8 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 9 "S206E-A Kakaako affordable housing development program
- 10 established; purpose. (a) There is established the Kakaako
- 11 affordable housing development program within the authority to
- 12 provide affordable housing in the Kakaako community development
- 13 district established pursuant to section 206E-32.
- 14 (b) The purpose of this program shall be to create and
- 15 preserve affordable housing units within Honolulu's urban core;
- 16 provided that funds administered through this program shall not
- 17 be used for residential development in the area described in
- 18 section 206E-31.5.
- 19 §206E-B Kakaako affordable housing development fund. (a)
- 20 There is established the Kakaako affordable housing development
- 21 fund. Funds appropriated and all moneys received or collected

19	(c)	The subsidies and other assistance provided by the
20		shall be limited to:
21	(1)	\$75 per square foot for up to eight hundred square
22		feet per unit; and

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- 1 (2) No more than one thousand units in the aggregate." SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 3 , for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the same sum, for fiscal year 2008-4 5 2009, to be deposited to the Kakaako affordable housing 6 development fund for the purposes of section 2. SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the Kakaako 7 affordable housing development fund the sum of \$ , or so 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and 9 10 the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009, for the purposes of section 2. 11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii 12 community development authority for the purposes of this Act. 13 SECTION 5. Any funds remaining in the Kakaako affordable 14 housing development fund on June 30, 2012, shall be returned to 15 the general fund. 16 SECTION 6. In codifying the new sections added by section 17 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute 18 19 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating

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the new sections in this Act.

1 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007, and

2 shall be repealed on June 30, 2012.
