SECTION 1. Section 706-660.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended to read as follows:

(1) Notwithstanding section 706-669, a person who, in the course of 5 6 committing or attempting to commit a felony, causes the death or inflicts serious or substantial bodily injury upon a person who 7 is[÷ 8 9 (1) Sixty] sixty years of age or older; 10 [(2) Blind, a paraplegic, or a quadriplegic; or 11 [(3) Eight] eight years of age or younger; 12 and such disability is known or reasonably should be known to 13 the defendant, shall, if not subjected to an extended term of 14 imprisonment pursuant to section 706-662, be sentenced to a 15 mandatory minimum term of imprisonment without possibility of 16 parole as follows:
