A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR A COMMUNITY ANTI-DRUG FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that drug abuse,

 particularly the use of crystal methamphetamine, also known as

 "ice," is the greatest threat to community health and public
- 4 safety on the island of Hawaii. Although law enforcement
- 5 constitutes strategic element in combating drug abuse, the
- $\mathbf{6}$ community cannot solely rely on increases in the policing and
- 7 prosecution of abusers, nor can drug abuse be solved through
- 8 institutional rehabilitation and education. Grass roots
- 9 community involvement is a necessary element in combating this
- 10 plague upon the island of Hawaii. In an effort to stimulate and
- 11 implement grass roots community involvement in the fight against
- 12 drug abuse, the county of Hawaii developed the community
- 13 anti-drug fund and implemented various drug and substance abuse
- 14 services and programs, such as the healing our island fund,
- 15 which is based on the community anti-drug fund. The healing our
- 16 island fund was established two years ago and thus far, one
- 17 hundred thirty community groups have received grants to address
- 18 drug and other substance abuse services and programs. The $HB1177\ HD1\ HMS\ 2007-1795$



- 1 community anti-drug fund is intended for non-501(c)(3)
- 2 organizations and community associations to conduct anti-drug
- 3 activities in their communities with a focus on the youth,
- 4 family, and neighborhood. These grants are limited to requests
- 5 of no more than \$2,000 and are used for grass roots
- 6 community-based anti-drug and substance abuse events.
- 7 The community anti-drug fund is administered by the Hawaii
- 8 county resource center, a division of the Hawaii county
- 9 department of research and development. All grant requests are
- 10 evaluated by a committee of ten to fifteen representatives from
- 11 county, state, and community members from every district of the
- 12 island of Hawaii. All grant requests that are not funded are
- 13 provided assistance from the Hawaii county resource center to
- 14 improve their applications and increase the likelihood of
- 15 funding in the future. Applications are reviewed monthly, and
- 16 funding is made available the following month. All grantees are
- 17 required to submit a follow-up report detailing their program's
- 18 or initiative's impact on their community and the number of
- 19 participants in anti-drug efforts.
- The community anti-drug fund has been very well-received in
- 21 the community for the past two years. Its purpose, to provide
- 22 support to grass roots and community-based anti-drug efforts,

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- 1 has encouraged multiple communities to collaborate and cooperate
- 2 in prevention efforts to address substance abuse issues. The
- 3 county of Hawaii looks forward to continuing this program with
- 4 continued state legislative support.
- 5 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- $\mathbf{6}$ revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$\\$ or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the
- 8 sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 9 year 2008-2009 for the county of Hawaii to implement grass roots
- 10 community involvement through the community anti-drug fund.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the county of
- 12 Hawai'i for the purposes of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
