BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 706, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding to part I a new section to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§706- Presentence mental and medical examination. (1)
5	Before imposing sentence, the court may order a defendant who
6	has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor to submit to
7	mental or other medical observation and examination for a period
8	not exceeding sixty days or a longer period, not to exceed the
9	length of permissible imprisonment, as the court determines to
10	be necessary for the purpose. In addition thereto or in the
11	alternative, the court may appoint one or more qualified
12	psychiatrists, physicians, or licensed psychologists to make the
13	examination. The examiner or examiners shall be appointed from
14	a list of certified examiners as determined by the state
15	department of health. The report of the examination shall be
16	submitted to the court.
17	(2) As used in this section, unless the context otherwise
