### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DIVISION OF CONSUMER ADVOCACY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The division of consumer advocacy of the
- 2 department of commerce and consumer affairs is statutorily
- 3 mandated to represent, protect, and advance the interests of all
- 4 consumers of utility services. The field of utility regulation
- 5 is highly complex and specialized, and requires an equally high
- 6 level of expertise to ensure that consumers are well represented
- 7 and protected.
- 8 By Act 143, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, the legislature
- 9 recognized that there is a need for the division to function
- 10 more effectively and efficiently in light of changing regulatory
- 11 conditions, duties, and requirements, and advances in
- 12 technology. Act 143 also mandates the division to conduct a
- 13 review of its organization and to propose any necessary
- 14 legislation that will enable it to more effectively protect and
- 15 represent the interests of consumers. This measure represents
- 16 the division's first step toward reaching the goals and
- 17 objectives set forth in Act 143.

SECTION 2. Section 269-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 amended to read as follows: 7 "§269-52 Division of consumer advocacy; personnel. There 8 shall be a division of consumer advocacy within the department 9 of commerce and consumer affairs to provide administrative 10 support to the director of commerce and consumer affairs acting 11 in the capacity of consumer advocate. The director may employ 12 and at pleasure dismiss an executive administrator, who shall be 13 exempt from chapter 76, may define the executive administrator's 14 powers and duties, and fix the executive administrator's 15 compensation. The director may employ engineers, accountants, 16 investigators, clerks, and stenographers as may be necessary for 17 the performance of the consumer advocate's functions, in 18 accordance with chapter 76; provided that: 19 The director may employ up to [four] ten utility (1)20 analysts exempt from chapter 76; and 21 (2) Each analyst shall possess at least the minimum 22

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qualifications required of comparable experts in the relevant industry." 2 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the public 3 utilities commission special fund the sum of \$168,000, or so 4 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and 5. the sum of \$168,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary for 6 7 fiscal year 2008-2009, to be deposited into the compliance resolution fund to be used for the operations of the division of 8 9 consumer advocacy, department of commerce and consumer affairs. 10 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the public 11 utilities commission for the purposes of this section. SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the compliance 12 13 resolution fund the sum of \$168,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the sum of \$168,000, 14 15 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009, for two permanent utility analyst positions exempt from 16 chapter 76, Hawaii Revised Statutes, in the division of consumer 17 advocacy, department of commerce and consumer affairs. 18 19 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department of commerce and consumer affairs for the purposes of this 20 section. 21 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 22

TITLE

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE DIVISION OF

CONSUMER ADVOCACY.

PURPOSE:

To increase the number of utility analysts exempt from chapter 76, Hawaii Revised Statutes, assigned to the Division of Consumer Advocacy ("Division") from four to ten, and to provide funding for two permanent

utility analysts.

MEANS:

Amend section 269-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Appropriate \$168,000 out of the Public Utilities Commission Special Fund for fiscal years 2007-2008 and 2008-2009 for deposit into the Compliance Resolution Fund. Appropriate \$168,000 out of the Compliance Resolution Fund for fiscal years 2007-2008 and 2008-2009 to fund two permanent utility analysts.

JUSTIFICATION:

Adding the requested number of positions will allow the Division to more effectively represent, advance, and protect the interests of consumers of public utility services. Presently, the Division is seeking funding for two permanent utility analysts. Furthermore, Act 143, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, also mandates the Division to conduct a review of its organization and to propose any necessary legislation that will enable it to more effectively protect and represent the interests of consumers.

Impact on the public: Adding the requested positions will enable the Division to more fully represent, protect, and advance the interests of all consumers of utility services.

Impact on the department and other agencies: This bill will improve the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs' efficiency and Page 2

effectiveness in dealing with utility matters and will also increase the quality of work it produces in its efforts to better represent consumers. Moreover, an increase in timely

filings may allow the Public Utilities

Commission to render more timely decisions on

utility applications.
