6	claiming Hawaii as their residence of record. Passenger motor
7	vehicles owned by members of the national guard, reserves, armed
8	services, including Coast Guard, who are in good standing and
9	residents of the State of Hawaii shall be exempt from vehicle
10	tax and registration fees. This exemption shall not extend to
11	vehicles used for commercial purposes."

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES.

PURPOSE:

To provide vehicle tax and registration fee exemption to members of the National Guard and

reserves.

MEANS:

Add new section to Chapter 249, Hawaii Revised

Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION: This exemption initiative is submitted to honor Hawaii residents that have volunteered to serve in the National Guard and reserves, and other armed services, including the Coast Guard. supporting America's war on terrorism, many Hawaii residents, enlisted in the National Guard, reserves, and other armed services, including the Coast Guard.

> This exemption will provide an incentive for retaining these combat experienced soldiers in their respective military units. Additionally, any benefits that the State and counties provide to Hawaii residents who have enlisted in the armed services, including the National Guard, Reserves, and Coast Guard, will assist in recruiting young men and women to become soldiers, sailors, airmen, and marines. Maintaining our military unit strength and personnel readiness is essential, when called upon, to perform its public safety mission. Passage of this measure would provide a tremendous incentive for the members of the National Guard and reserves to continue their membership upon their return from active duty and for active duty personnel to continue to serve their country.

Impact on the public: Loss of revenue to the State and counties is estimated at \$2,000,000.

Impact on the department and other agencies: Passage of this measure will provide an incentive to the National Guard, reserves, and active duty armed forces personnel to recruit and retain their troops.

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Department of Transportation will lose revenues generated from the state registration fees and state vehicle weight taxes.

Department of Health will lose revenues generated from state registration fees.

Counties will lose revenues generated from vehicle registration fees, vehicle weight taxes, and beautification fees.

GENERAL FUND: None.

OTHER FUNDS:

Loss of state registration fee revenues of \$200,000 from the State Highway fund.

Loss of state registration fee revenues of \$50,000 from the Emergency Medical Services Special fund.

Loss of state vehicle weight tax revenues of \$440,000 from the State Highway fund.

Loss of city registration fee revenues of \$205,000.

Loss of city weight tax revenues of \$1,055,000.

Loss of beautification fee revenues of \$50,000.
