"(b) All fees paid and collected pursuant to this section 5 6 and rules adopted in accordance with chapter 91 from facilities 7 seeking licensure or certification by the department, including 8 but not limited to hospitals, nursing homes, home health 9 agencies, intermediate care facilities for the mentally retarded, freestanding outpatient surgical facilities, adult day 10 health care centers, rural health centers, laboratories, adult 11 residential care homes, expanded adult residential care homes, 12 13 developmental disability domiciliary homes, assisted living facilities, therapeutic living programs, and special treatment 14 facilities, shall be deposited into the [hospital and medical 15 facilities] office of health care assurance special fund created 16 under section 321-1.4. Any other entities required by law to be 17 18 licensed by the department shall also be subject to reasonable 19 fees established by the department by rules adopted in accordance with chapter 91." 20

21 SECTION 3. Section 321-15.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
22 amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT:

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HOSPITAL AND MEDICAL FACILITIES SPECIAL FUND.

PURPOSE: To (1) rename the special fund to reflect the current name of the Office of Health Care Assurance (OHCA), formerly known as the Hospital and Medical Facilities Branch (HMFB); (2) require that all moneys collected by OHCA in the form of fees and fines be deposited into that account; and (3) allow the moneys deposited into the special fund to be used to offset OHCA's operational expenses.

MEANS: Amend sections 321-1.4 and 321-11.5(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION:

Currently moneys in this fund may be expended only to assist in offsetting OHCA's educational program expenses. Due to the increasing demands placed on OHCA, operating expenses have increased. Additional funds are needed to meet the increased costs of travel (air, ground transportation, per diem), mileage of staff, costs for office supplies, equipment, overtime, training of staff to ensure competence, (registration costs for training, travel costs if out-of-state, etc.), training of providers (materials development and purchase, cost of meeting sites, etc.).

The state licensing section's responsibilities have increased under section 321-15.6, HRS, which was enacted in 2003 and requires unannounced visits to adult residential care homes statewide. With this new

requirement, OHCA's travel to the neighbor islands and mileage on Oahu has increased. Previously, staff traveled to the neighbor islands once quarterly to conduct inspections. With this additional requirement, staff needs to travel to the neighbor islands at least once or twice monthly for period of up to 4 days, to ensure that inspections are unannounced. Often operators are not at home, thus revisits are required.

There has also been an increase in the number of complaints received statewide from an average of 5-8 complaints per month to 8-14 complaints per month.

With the increased total number of unannounced and complaint visits, there has also been an increase in the need to conduct follow-up visits to community-based settings due to an increased number of citations issued at the serious and substantive level resulting from visits.

There is a need to ensure staff competency to carry out their responsibilities. Currently there are no operating costs to pay for registration fees, materials, and travel if training is out-of-state. In the past OHCA has relied on resources we have been able to obtain free of charge, and in one instance we were able to send two staff to attend training provided by the Department of the Attorney General, Medicaid Investigation Division (MID). However, free training opportunities are no longer readily available. Relying on training on an inconsistent basis will not ensure adequate training of staff.

In order for OHCA to carry out its functions, it needs adequate funding

and competent staff. As the general fund may not always be adequate to fund all mandates, this measure will allow for OHCA to offset operating costs in lieu of annual requests for budget increases.
