## A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION FOR THE DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for
- 2 immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 3 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.
- 4 SECTION 2. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate
- 5 additional funds to the department of health for the State's
- 6 medicaid title XIX programs, which include the developmental
- 7 disabilities or mentally retarded home and community-based
- 8 services and the medicaid state plan intermediate care
- 9 facilities for the mentally retarded in the community program,
- 10 to meet a critical funding emergency. The additional funds are
- 11 necessary to support current clients and to reasonably admit
- 12 individuals into the program to fulfill the developmental
- 13 disabilities division's obligations under the settlement
- 14 agreement in HDRC v. State, United States District Court, Civil
- 15 No. 03-00524 HG-KSC, and comply with the United States Supreme
- 16 Court's decision in Olmstead v. Zimring, 527 U.S. 581, 119 S.

- 1 Ct. 2176 (1999), and the requirements of chapter 333F, Hawaii
- 2 Revised Statutes, to support people to live in the community.
- 3 The developmental disabilities interdepartmental transfer
- 4 fund or U-fund ceiling constitutes a limit on the department of
- 5 health's ability to receive federal medicaid reimbursements
- 6 transferred from the department of human services back to the
- 7 department of health. These funds are in turn reallocated for
- 8 expenditures to make further claims for federal reimbursement.
- 9 Once the department of health has exceeded the statutory
- 10 limitation of the U-fund, the ability to expend the resources
- 11 that it receives is impaired. Therefore, the increase in the U-
- 12 fund ceiling is now critically necessary to ensure timely
- 13 expenditure of the general fund emergency appropriation
- 14 contained in this measure.
- 15 SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 16 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
- 17 37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
- 18 that the general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2006-
- 19 2007 has already been exceeded by \$90,137,694 or 1.68 per cent.
- 20 The appropriations contained in this Act will cause the state
- 21 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2006-2007 to be
- exceeded by an additional \$4,980,523, or an additional 0.093 per

- 1 cent. The calculation contained in the foregoing sentence
- 2 relates only to the amount of general funds appropriated in this
- 3 Act for fiscal year 2006-2007. The reasons for exceeding the
- 4 general fund expenditure ceiling are that the appropriations
- 5 made in this Act are necessary to serve the public interest and
- 6 to meet the needs provided for by this Act.
- 7 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$4,980,523 or so much
- 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007 to carry
- 10 out the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the developmental
- 12 disabilities interdepartmental transfer fund the sum of
- 13 \$4,111,237 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 14 year 2006-2007 to carry out the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 6. The sums appropriated in sections 4 and 5 shall
- 16 be expended by the department of health.
- 17 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

### Description:

Appropriates \$4,980,523 in general fund revenues and \$4,111,237 from the Developmental Disabilities Interdepartmental Transfer Fund as an emergency appropriation to enable the Developmental Disabilities Division (DDD) to meet state-approved target numbers under the current Medicaid home and community based service and ensure the receipt of federal Medicaid reimbursements.
