BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 353-22.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: "[+]\$353-22.5[+] Garnishment to cover nonbudgeted costs. 3 All moneys received by windfall, judgment, or settlement or 4 earned by a committed person shall be subject to garnishment, 5 levy, or any like process of attachment by the director for a 6 cause of action or claim against the committed person in the 7 following order of priority: 8 Restitution to victims; 9 (1) (2) Child support payments by order of the court; 10 Crime victim compensation fees by order of the court; 11 (3) $[\frac{(3)}{}]$ (4) Replacement costs for any facility damage that 12 may have been caused by the committed person and all 13 other costs associated with the facility damage; and 14 $[\frac{4}{4}]$ (5) Reimbursement for the extraordinary cost of 15 photocopying or postage [which] that has been advanced 16 by the department for litigation purposes. 17

All moneys collected by the department pursuant to paragraph

[(3) or] (4) or (5) shall be used to reimburse, in whole or in

part, the nonbudgeted costs and expenses."

SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

PURPOSE:

To provide the Department of Public Safety with statutory authority to garnish inmate wages to pay court ordered crime victim

compensation fees.

MEANS:

Amend section 353-22.5, Hawaii Revised

Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

Section 351-62.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires the court to impose a mandatory crime victim compensation fee against criminal offenders. These compensation fees are deposited into the Crime Victim Compensation Special fund and used to pay compensation to victims of violent crime. Currently, there is no statutory authority for the Department of Public Safety to garnish inmate wages to pay these compensation fees. The proposed amendment provides that authorization.

Impact on the public: If the Commission does not have sufficient revenue to pay compensation or operating expenses victims will not be able to get the compensation they need for medical and other crime-related expenses so that they can heal from the physical and mental impact of violent crime.

The proposed bill will increase Commission revenue, which will, in turn, enable the Commission to serve more of Hawaii's violent crime victims.
