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#### JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT:

Public Safety

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO CONTROLLED

SUBSTANCES.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this bill is to update chapter 329, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to include new language and amendments made to the federal Controlled Substances Act relating to controlled substances and regulated chemicals to manufacture controlled

substances.

MEANS:

Amend sections 329-14(e), 329-16, 329-20(b), 329-22, and 329-75, HRS.

JUSTIFICATION:

Proposed amendments to chapter 329, HRS, will accomplish the following:

- (1) Update section 329-14(e), HRS to be consistent with federal law by adding the category heading "depressants" to section 329-14(e) Schedule I controlled substances having a depressant effect on the central nervous system.
- (2) Update section 329-16, HRS to include language and descriptions of controlled substances to be consistent with federal law.
- (3) Update section 329-20(b), HRS to include language and descriptions of controlled substances to be consistent with federal law.
- (4) Proposed amendment to section 329-22(b), HRS, will add the depressant drug Pregabalin [(S)-3-(aminomethyl)-5-methlhexanoic acid] to Schedule V, as required by section 329-11(d), HRS.
- (5) Proposed amendment to section 329-75, HRS, to remove the exemption for pseudoephedrine over the counter products that are packed in gel caps or liquids is necessary due to language in the federal Combat Methamphetamine Act of 2005, as required by section 329-61(c), HRS.

Impact on the public: Allows the public to utilize the controlled substance Pregablin and makes Hawaii's controlled substance laws consistent with that of federal law.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
The proposed amendment will assist Narcotics
Enforcement Division in clarifying
regulations of the Uniform Controlled
Substances Act.
