A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 "PART . TESTS FOR DEPLETED URANIUM.
- 5 §321- Soil, air, and water samples required; depleted
- 6 uranium. The department of health shall take soil samples
- 7 within five hundred meters of all military bases in the state at
- 8 least once every three months to monitor the level of depleted
- 9 uranium contamination. Soil samples shall be taken around the
- 10 perimeter of the military bases at least every meters. The
- 11 department of health shall also take air and water samples in
- 12 the area surrounding all military bases in the state at least
- 13 once every three months to monitor the level of depleted uranium
- 14 contamination.
- 15 §321- Rulemaking. The director of health may adopt
- 16 rules, pursuant to chapter 91, necessary for the purposes of
- 17 this chapter.

- 1 §321- Annual report to legislature. The director shall
- 2 submit a report summarizing its findings to the legislature and
- 3 the committees on health of both houses of the legislature no
- 4 later than twenty days prior to each regular session."
- 5 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sums of \$ or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and \$
- 8 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009
- 9 for the department of health to take soil, air, and water
- 10 samples in accordance with this Act.
- 11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 12 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

Report Title:

Depleted Uranium; Mandatory Soil, Air, and Water Samples

Description:

Requires the Department of Health to take soil samples within 500 meters of all military bases in Hawaii to assess for depleted uranium, at least once every 3 months, and annually report to the legislature. Requires air and water samples for the same purpose. (HB1452 HD1)
