A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SOLID WASTE CONTROL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 342H-37, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: "(c) Felony disposal of solid waste is a class C felony 3 for which a maximum fine of \$50,000 for each separate offense 4 may be imposed[-]; provided that any person who violates this 5 6 section shall be fined not less than: (1) \$2,500 for the first offense under this section; and 7 8 (2) \$10,000 for each subsequent offense under this 9 section. **10** Each day of violation shall constitute a separate offense. 11 Any vehicle used in the commission of an offense under 12 this section shall be seized for forfeiture to the State, 13 subject to the requirements of chapter 712A." 14 SECTION 2. Section 342H-39, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 15 "(b) Petty misdemeanor disposal of solid waste [is] shall 16 17 be punishable by:

1	(1)	A fine of not more than \$25,000 for each separate

(3) (2) Revocation or suspension by court order of any 1 2 contractor's license or any applicable certificate of 3 authorization from the public utilities commission. Each day of violation shall constitute a separate offense." 4 5 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 6 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were begun, before its effective date. 7 8 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 10 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
