A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE ETHICS CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that public disclosure of 2 documents related to a complaint filed with the ethics 3 commission is in the public interest because it furthers public 4 accountability of public officials and helps to vindicate 5 officials whose charges have been denied. 6 The purpose of this Act is to make available to the public 7 documents relating to charges concerning alleged violations of 8 the ethics code filed against a state employee by a private 9 entity or organization upon final disposition of the charge.
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 11 by adding a new section to part IV to be appropriately
- 12 designated and to read as follows:
- 13 "§84- Charge filed by a person or organization other
- 14 than the commission. (a) If a charge concerning alleged
- 15 violations of this chapter is filed by a person or organization
- 16 other than the commission, the following shall be a matter of
- 17 public record upon final disposition of the charge:



1	(1)	Any charge and any answer to the charge;
2	(2)	Any rebuttal filed by the person or organization that
3		has filed a charge in response to any answer to the
4		charge, and any response to the rebuttal; and
5	(3)	The final disposition of the charge, whether by order
6		to dismiss, issuance of an informal advisory opinion,
7		decision after a hearing, or final disposition by any
8		other means.
9	(b)	A person or organization that has filed a charge with
10	the commission shall be informed of the status of the charge	
11	upon request."	
12	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
