A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BUILDING CODES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to promote the
2	health, safety, and welfare of the occupants or users of
3	buildings and structures and the general public through the
4	adoption of a uniform statewide model building code.
5	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
6	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
7	as follows:
8	"CHAPTER
9	STATEWIDE MODEL BUILDING CODE AND DESIGN STANDARDS
10	§ -1 Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to promote
11	the health, safety, and welfare of the occupants or users of
12	buildings and structures and the general public through the
13	adoption of a statewide model building code and design
14	standards.
15	§ -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter, the
16	following terms have the following meanings, unless the context
17	clearly requires otherwise:

"Council" means the state building code council. HB LRB 07-1396-01.doc

4	\$	-3 State building code; establishment. (a) The					
5	departmen	t of accounting and general services shall adopt rules

8	(b)	The design of all state building construction shall be					
9	in compli	ance with the state building code within one year of					
10	its effec	tive date.					
11	(C)	The state building code shall include the latest					
12	edition o	f:					
13	(1)	The International Building Code, published by the					
14		International Code Council; and					
15	(2)	Hawaii design standards implementing the criteria					
16		developed by the department of defense pursuant to Act					
17		5, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, applicable to					
18		emergency shelters built to comply with hurricane					
19		resistant criteria including enhanced hurricane					
20		protection areas capable of withstanding a five					
21		hundred-year hurricane event, and essential government					
22		facilities requiring continuity of operations; and					

1	(3)	Code provisions based on nationally published codes or
2		standards that include but are not limited to
3		residential and hurricane resistive standards for one-
4		and two-family residential construction, fire,
5		elevator, electrical, plumbing, mechanical, energy
6		conservation standards for building design and
7		construction, and private sewage disposal.
8	\$	-4 State building code council. (a) There is hereby
9	establish	ed a state building code council. The council shall be
10	placed fo	r administrative purposes in the department of
11	accountin	g and general services.
12	(b)	The council shall consist of nine voting members and
13	one nonvo	ting member. The members shall include:
14	(1)	One county building official from each of the four
15		counties;
16	(2)	One member representing the state fire council;
17	(3)	One member representing the department of health who
18		has significant experience in building mechanical and
19		sewage disposal systems;
20	(4)	One member representing the department of labor and
21		industrial relations who has significant experience in
22		fire safety;

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- 1 (5) One member representing the Structural Engineers 2 Association of Hawaii; 3 (6) One member representing the American Institute of 4 Architects, Hawaii State Council; and 5 (7) The comptroller or the comptroller's designated 6 representative who shall be a nonvoting member. Members shall serve without compensation but shall be 7 (C) 8 reimbursed for actual expenses, including travel expenses, 9 necessary for the performance of their duties. 10 The chairperson of the council shall be elected 11 annually from among its members by a majority vote of the 12 members of the council. 13 -5 Executive director and executive assistant. (a) 14 The council shall select an executive director, who shall serve at the pleasure of the council, and who shall have 15 16 administrative abilities and expertise in engineering or 17 architecture. 18 The council or the executive director shall select an 19 executive assistant, who shall have experience in statutory and

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administrative rulemaking processes.

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1	(1)	Establish a comprehensive state building code;
2	(2)	Appoint a subcommittee comprised solely of each of the
3		council members holding the county building official
4		seats, whose duty shall be to recommend any necessary
5		or desirable state amendments to the model codes. Any
6		recommended state amendments shall require the
7		unanimous agreement of the subcommittee;
8	(3)	The council shall review and adopt, as appropriate,
9		new model building codes within eighteen months of
10		their official published date; and
11	(4)	The council shall provide education and technical
12		training and administrative assistance in the form of
13		services or grants at the State and county levels
14		relating to the implementation and enforcement of the
15		state building code and county building codes adopted
16		pursuant to this chapter.
17	\$	-7 General authority. The state building code council
18	may:	
19	(1)	Appoint other investigative technical expertise
20		committees which may include council members; and
21	(2)	Expend money for technical references, equipment,
22		supplies, and other operating expenses; and

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- 1 (3) Contract for the conduct of research studies and 2 provision of technical services. -8 Prohibitions. The council shall not adopt 3 4 provisions of the state building code that: 5 Relate to administrative, permitting, enforcement, and (1)6 inspection procedures of each county; 7 (2) Prohibit indigenous pre-western contact Hawaiian 8 architecture; and 9 Conflict with chapter 464. 10 -9 Exemptions. Upon adoption of rules under this 11 chapter, the State shall be exempted from county building codes 12 for state building construction. 13 -10 Annual report. The department of accounting and 14 general services shall submit an annual report to the
- 15 legislature no less than twenty days prior to the commencement 16 of the regular session. The report shall detail the activities 17 and accomplishments of the council.
- 18 -11 County authority to amend. (a) The governing 19 body of each county is authorized to amend the state building 20 code as it applies within that jurisdiction, in accordance with 21 section 46-1.5(13), without approval of the council, no later 22 than two years after the adoption of the state building code.

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- 1 Each county shall use the model codes and standards listed in
- 2 section -3, as the referenced model building codes and
- 3 standards for its county building code ordinance.
- 4 (b) County amendments shall be consistent with the minimum
- 5 performance standards of the state building code and the
- 6 objectives enumerated in section -1
- 7 (c) If the counties do not amend the statewide model codes
- 8 within the two-year timeframe pursuant to subsection (a), the
- 9 state building code shall become applicable as an interim county
- 10 building code until the time that the county adopts its
- 11 amendments."
- 12 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000, or so much
- 14 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, for
- 15 operations of the state building code council.
- 16 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000, or so much
- 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the
- 19 same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 20 2008-2009, for technical assistance services to the state
- 21 building code council.
