A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that an innovative 2 approach in encouraging sustainable growth and economic development is to address the issue at the local level. Instead 3 of taking a "top-down" approach where policies and directives 4 5 are issued from a centralized agency, community-based planning represents an alternative approach that offers communities an 6 7 opportunity to take the initiative in developing plans that 8 address their unique, individual concerns.

9 The purpose of this Act is to promote sustainable growth10 and economic development in Hawaii by establishing the:

11 (1) Community-based sustainability grants special fund;12 and

13 (2) Hawaii community-based sustainability advisory board.
14 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
15 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
16 as follows:

4	"Advisory board" means the Hawaii community-based

10	fund; established. (a) There is established within the state
11	treasury a fund to be known as the community-based
12	sustainability grants special fund and administered by the

15	shall be funded through legislative appropriations.
16	(c) Moneys in the community-based sustainability grants
17	special fund shall be used to provide grants for planning and
18	implementation of, and technical assistance for, sustainable

Other state 2 agencies shall provide assistance upon the request of the advisory board. 3 4 (f) The advisory board shall: Upon request by the office, provide assistance in 5 (1)reviewing applications for grant awards under this 6 7 chapter; 8 (2) Provide technical assistance to applicants who request 9 assistance in completing their applications for grant 10 awards under this chapter; and (3) Provide technical assistance to other entities 11 12 involved in community-based sustainable development, 13 to the extent practicable." 14 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000 for fiscal 15 year 2007-2008 to be deposited into the community-based 16 17 sustainability grants special fund. 18 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 19 budget and finance for the purposes of this Act. 20 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the community-21 based sustainability grants special fund the sum of \$500,000 for 22 fiscal year 2007-2008 to be used for the purposes of the fund. HB HMS 2007-1378
