A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. In 2001, the Hawaii educator loan program and special fund were established to recruit college students to 2 3 become educators and to ensure that these graduates teach in our public schools. The legislature finds that although the program 4 has proven to be successful, the State is still experiencing a 5 6 teacher shortage. In particular, hard-to-fill positions, 7 including special education, regular education shortage categories, and teacher positions in rural areas have posed a 8 9 significant teacher recruitment and retention challenge to our 10 public schools. 11 The legislature also finds that a similar problem exists 12 with attracting and retaining educational assistants, especially certified educational assistants, to work in schools located in 13

rural areas. Community colleges and adult community schools

offer educational assistant certification training programs, but

only in limited areas, where access may be a problem for those

who live in rural areas. Moreover, many educational assistants

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- 1 who are already working part- or full-time in these communities
- 2 cannot afford the tuition costs at a community college.
- 3 The purposes of this Act are to establish an educational
- 4 assistant loan program and to establish a loan forgiveness
- 5 program to recruit and retain qualified teachers and educational
- 6 assistants to work in rural areas throughout the state.
- 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 9 and to read as follows:
- 10 "§302A- Educator and educational assistant loan
- 11 forgiveness program; special fund. (a) There is created the
- 12 educator and educational assistant loan forgiveness program to
- 13 be administered by the department of education in partnership
- 14 with a financial institution whose operations are principally
- 15 conducted in Hawaii, for the purpose of providing financial
- 16 support to teachers who complete a state-approved teacher
- 17 education program and to educational assistants who complete a
- 18 state-approved certification training program and agree to teach
- 19 in the Hawaii public school system at a school located in a
- 20 rural area, as determined by the department and for a period of
- 21 time to be determined prior to each award. Eligibility shall be
- 22 determined by the department on a competitive basis. The amount



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2 on need for financial aid and proof of a state-approved teacher education degree. The amount awarded to an educational 3 4 assistant shall be determined by the department based on need 5 for financial aid and proof of completion of a state-approved certification training program. The maximum amount that a 6 teacher or educational assistant may receive under this program 7 8 shall be an aggregate amount equivalent to tuition payments and 9 costs of textbooks and other instructional materials necessary 10 to complete a state-approved teacher education program or state-11 approved certification training program. 12 (b) There is created in the treasury of the State the 13 educator and educational assistant loan forgiveness program special fund, for the purpose of providing funds pursuant to 14 15 subsection (a). The following may be deposited into the special 16 fund: appropriations made by the legislature; private

contributions; repayment of loans, including interest and

payments received on account of principal; moneys received from

collection agencies under subsection (g); and moneys from other

1	(1)	Moneys on balance in the special fund at the close of
2		each fiscal year shall remain in that fund and shall
3		not lapse to the credit of the general fund; and
4	(2)	An amount from the special fund not exceeding five per
5		cent of the total amount of the special fund may be
6		set by the department to be used for administrative
7		expenses incurred in administering the special fund.
8	<u>(c)</u>	The department shall adopt rules to implement the
9	educator	and educational assistant loan forgiveness program.
10	The rules	shall be adopted pursuant to chapter 91, but shall be
11	exempt fr	om the public notice and public hearing requirements.
12	<u>(d)</u>	Liability for repayment of a loan shall be canceled
13	upon the	death or permanent total disability of the borrower.
14	<u>(e)</u>	If a graduate of the teacher education program subject
15	to this s	ection fails to teach in the Hawaii public school
16	system fo	r a minimum number of years, as determined by the
17	departmen	t prior to the award, from the recipient's original
18	date of e	mployment with the department of education, excluding
19	sabbatica	l and other forms of temporary leaves of absence, then
20	the recip	ient shall repay any remaining loan balance.
21	<u>(f)</u>	If an educational assistant who is a graduate of a
22	state-app	roved certification training program subject to this
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- 1 section fails to teach in the Hawaii public school system for a minimum number of years, as determined by the department prior 2 to the award, from the recipient's original date of employment 3 with the department of education, excluding temporary leaves of 4 absence, then the recipient shall repay any remaining loan 5 6 balance. 7 (g) In accordance with chapter 103D, the department may 8 enter into written contracts with collection agencies for the purpose of collecting delinquent loans. All payments collected, 9 10 exclusive of a collection agency's commissions, shall revert, and be credited, to the loan fund. A collection agency that 11 12 enters into a written contract with the department of education 13 for the collection of delinquent loans pursuant to this section may collect a commission from the debtor in accordance with the 14 15 terms of, and up to the amounts authorized in, the written 16 contract." SECTION 3. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended by adding a new subpart to part II to be appropriately 18 19 designated and to read as follows: 20 HAWAII EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANT LOANS
- 22 amounts. There is created the Hawaii educational assistant loan HB1530 HD1 HMS 2007-2541

§304A-A Hawaii educational assistant loans; eligibility;

- 1 program to be administered by the University of Hawaii, to
- 2 provide financial support to students who complete a state-
- 3 approved certification training program, who agree to serve as
- 4 an educational assistant in the Hawaii public school system.
- 5 Eligibility shall be determined by the university on a
- 6 competitive basis. The amount to be loaned to a student shall
- 7 be determined by the board of regents based on need for
- 8 financial aid and proof of acceptance into a state-approved
- 9 certification training program available through the university
- 10 community college system. The maximum amount of loans that a
- 11 student may receive under this program shall be an aggregate
- 12 amount equivalent to tuition payments and costs of textbooks and
- 13 other instructional materials necessary to complete a state-
- 14 approved certification training program.
- 15 §304A-B Repayment of loans; waiver; collection. (a) All
- 16 loans made under this subpart shall bear interest at five per
- 17 cent simple interest. Repayment of principal and interest
- 18 charges shall commence one year after certification or three
- 19 months after a loan recipient ceases to be enrolled in a state-
- 20 approved certification training program and shall be paid in
- 21 periodic installments within a six-year period. The university

- 1 may charge late fees and all other reasonable costs for the
- 2 collection of delinquent loans.
- 3 (b) Upon a showing of proof that the loan recipient has
- 4 completed a state-approved certification training program and is
- 5 employed as a part- or full-time certified educational assistant
- 6 in the Hawaii public school system, one-tenth of the total
- 7 amount of the loan and interest shall be waived for every year
- 8 of the first five years, and the remaining balance shall be
- 9 waived after the sixth year that a loan recipient works in a
- 10 hard-to-fill position as determined by the superintendent of
- 11 education, including special education, regular education
- 12 shortage categories, or Title 1 schools, as a part-or full-time
- 13 educational assistant who has met the certification requirements
- 14 set forth by the department of education.
- 15 (c) Liability for repayment of a loan shall be canceled
- 16 upon the death or permanent total disability of the loan
- 17 recipient.
- 18 (d) If a loan recipient who is a certified educational
- 19 assistant subject to this section fails to serve in the Hawaii
- 20 public school system for a minimum of five consecutive years
- 21 from the loan recipient's original date of employment with the
- 22 department of education, excluding temporary leaves of absence,



- 1 then the loan recipient shall repay any remaining loan balance
- 2 at the rate of ten per cent simple interest.
- 3 (e) In accordance with chapter 103D, the university may
- 4 enter into written contracts with collection agencies for the
- 5 purpose of collecting delinquent student loans. All payments
- 6 collected, exclusive of a collection agency's commissions, shall
- 7 revert, and be credited, to the special fund established under
- 8 section 304A-E for the Hawaii educational assistant loan
- 9 program. A collection agency that enters into a written
- 10 contract with the university for the collection of delinquent
- 11 student loans, pursuant to this section, may collect a
- 12 commission from the debtor in accordance with the terms of, and
- 13 up to the amounts authorized in, the written contract.
- 14 §304A-C Capacity of minors. Any student otherwise
- 15 qualifying for a loan under this subpart shall not be
- 16 disqualified because the student is under the age of eighteen
- 17 years, and for the purpose of applying for, receiving, and
- 18 repaying the loan, any such person shall be deemed to have full
- 19 legal capacity to act and shall have all rights, powers,
- 20 privileges, and obligations of an adult with respect thereto.
- 21 §304A-D Rules. The university may adopt rules to
- 22 implement this subpart. The rules shall be adopted pursuant to

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1	chapter 91, but shall be exempt from the public notice and		
2	public hearing requirements."		
3	SECTION 4. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
4	amended by adding a new section to part V to be appropriately		
5	designated and to read as follows:		
6	"§304A-E Hawaii educational assistant loan program special		
7	fund. There is established the Hawaii educational assistant		
8	loan program special fund, to be administered by the University		
9	of Hawaii for the purpose of providing loans pursuant to section		
10	304A-A. The following may be deposited into the special fund:		
11	appropriations made by the legislature, private contributions,		
12	repayment of loans, including interest and payments received on		
13	account of principal, and moneys from other sources; provided		
14	that:		
15	(1) Moneys on balance in the special fund at the close of		
16	each fiscal year shall remain in that fund and shall		
17	not lapse to the credit of the general fund; and		
18	(2) An amount from the special fund not exceeding five per		
19	cent of the total amount of outstanding loans may be		
20	set by the university to be used for administrative		
21	expenses incurred in administering the special fund."		

- 1 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ for fiscal
- 3 year 2007-2008 and the same sum for fiscal year 2008-2009 for
- 4 deposit into the educator and educational assistant loan
- 5 forgiveness program special fund.
- 6 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the educator and
- 7 educational assistant loan forgiveness program special fund the
- 8 sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for
- 9 fiscal year 2007-2008 and the same sum or so much thereof as may
- 10 be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the purposes of the
- 11 State educator and educational assistant loan forgiveness
- 12 program.
- 13 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ for fiscal
- 15 year 2007-2008 and the same sum for fiscal year 2008-2009, for
- 16 deposit into the Hawaii educational assistant loan program
- 17 special fund.
- 18 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the educational
- 19 assistant loan program special fund the sum of \$ or so
- 20 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and
- 21 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal

- 1 year 2008-2009 for the purposes of the Hawaii educational
- 2 assistant loan program.
- 3 SECTION 9. The sums appropriated in sections 6 and 8 shall
- 4 be expended by the department of education and the University of
- 5 Hawaii, respectively, for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 10. In codifying the new sections added by this
- 7 Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute appropriate
- 8 section numbers for the letters used in designating the new
- 9 sections in this Act.
- 10 SECTION 11. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 12. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020;
- 12 provided that sections 5, 6, 7, and 8 shall take effect on July
- 13 1, 2020.

Teacher Education; Educational Assistants; Loans; Appropriation

Description:

Creates an educational assistant loan program and special fund in the University of Hawaii. Creates another special fund for certain loans to teachers and educational assistants to be forgiven after employment at rural public schools for a specified number of years as determined by the department of education. (HB1530 HD1)

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
