A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The legislature finds that numerous studies 1 SECTION 1. have recognized a national shortage of qualified nurses that 2 3 will reach a twenty per cent staffing shortfall by the year In 2006, Hawaii experienced a shortage of 960 registered 4 nurses that is estimated to grow to 2,220 by 2016 and 2,670 by 5 2020. A nursing shortage jeopardizes the quality of health care 6 provided in hospitals, nursing homes, hospices, clinics, and 7 other health care settings. Without enough registered nurses, 8 patient safety is at risk with rural and underserved communities 9 10 being most affected. The nursing shortage is exacerbated by the aging population 11 that is steadily increasing. Hawaii's population is aging 12 faster than the rest of the country. Between 2000 and 2020, the 13 number of people aged sixty and older will increase by almost 14 seventy-five per cent. Hawaii's registered nurse workforce is 15 also aging, with an increasing number of registered nurses soon 16 to retire. Estimates indicate that by 2015, thirty-one per cent 17

of Hawaii's current registered nurse workforce will retire. By



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2020, sixty-one per cent of Hawaii's current workforce will 1 retire. The already significant shortage of registered nurses 2 3 will worsen. 4 The legislature finds that the key to promoting health in Hawaii lies in efforts to increase the educational capacity of 5 6 the State's nursing programs, which are hampered by the number 7 of faculty and support positions that limit the admission of 8 additional students and by inadequate facilities. Increasing 9 faculty training and nursing graduates requires a minimum of two to five years. Adding teaching staff would allow additional 10 11 students to be admitted and expand learning resource 12 opportunities to satisfy growing student demands. The 13 legislature finds that an ongoing and strategic public sector 14 approach is necessary to sustain a robust, qualified nursing 15 workforce to meet Hawaii's health care needs into the future. 16 The legislature agrees with the University of Hawaii's 17 statewide nursing consortium commitment to maximize the State's investment in nursing education, without unnecessary duplication 18 19 among the various campuses. The legislature recognizes that the 20 University of Hawaii plays a vital role in nursing workforce

development in Hawaii.

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         The purpose of this Act is to make appropriations to the
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    University of Hawaii to hire more nursing faculty and support
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    positions, provide nursing scholarships and loans, and increase
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    facilities.
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         SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
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    revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of $4,260,508, or so
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    much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and
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    the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
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    year 2008-2009, for the University of Hawaii to hire additional
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    nursing personnel for the various campuses, as follows:

18	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000, or so much
19	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the
20	same sum,	or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
21	2008-2009	, for the University of Hawaii to create a graduate
22	nursing f	aculty loan program with loan forgiveness for those who
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- 1 work as faculty in the State of Hawaii after graduation;
- 2 provided that to be eligible for the graduate nursing faculty
- 3 loan:
- 4 (1) The individual shall be a Hawaii resident and enrolled
- 5 at a University of Hawaii nursing program as a full or
- 6 part-time student in a master of science in nursing
- 7 program;
- 8 (2) The program shall allow loan forgiveness of \$5,000 a
- 9 year for up to five years; and
- 10 (3) For every year of loan forgiveness, the recipient
- 11 shall work for one year as a nurse educator at the
- 12 University of Hawaii.
- 13 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000, or so much
- 15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the
- 16 same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 17 2008-2009, for the University of Hawaii to create a nursing
- 18 student scholarship program; provided that to be eligible for
- 19 the nursing student scholarship program:
- 20 (1) The individual shall be enrolled as a full or part-
- time student in a University of Hawaii associate,



1	bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree nursing
2	program; and
3	(2) Need and merit, such as class rank, grade point
4	average, and service activities, shall be considered
5	in selecting recipients.
6	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
7	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$750,000, or so much
8	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the
9	same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
10	2008-2009, for the University of Hawaii at Manoa school of
11	nursing and dental hygiene to:
12	(1) Conduct facility planning and development and tasks
13	necessary to expand the school's physical facility to
14	provide optimal educational experiences;
15	(2) Enable students to participate in cross disciplinary
16	education with other students in the health sciences;
17	and
18	(3) Provide temporary classrooms for all nursing programs.
19	SECTION 6. The sums appropriated in this Act shall be
20	expended by the University of Hawaii for the purposes of this
21	Act.
