A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 1 2 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 3 read as follows: 4 "§21- Legislative protocol fund; international 5 affairs. (a) There is established a legislative protocol fund 6 to be administered by the legislature. 7 (b) Appropriations made by the legislature shall be 8 deposited into the fund. 9 (c) The fund shall be used to welcome and extend protocol
- 10 courtesies to visiting international dignitaries and government
- 11 officials."
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 201-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 "[+] \$201-17[+] Office of international affairs;
- 15 established. (a) There is established, within the department
- 16 of business, economic development, and tourism, an office of
- 17 international affairs.
- 18 (b) The office shall:

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1	(1)	Develop policies that promote and strengthen relations
2		with other countries in the areas of international
3		business, economy, culture, education, and the arts;
4	(2)	Develop policies that promote transportation between,
5		and tourism with, other countries;
6	(3)	Develop and promote international telecommunications
7		and high technology exchanges;
8	(4)	Encourage the development of international sister-city
9		programs, pairing Hawaii cities with cities around the
10		globe for artistic, cultural, economic, educational,
11		and faith-based exchanges;
12	(5)	Develop and promote Hawaii as the economic, trade,
13		commerce, transportation, banking, [and] tourism,
14		regional headquarters, and international conferences
15		hub of the [Pacific; Asia-Pacific region;
16	(6)	Develop an international affairs and peace education
17		curriculum that includes studies of international
18		affairs and peace initiatives and takes a proactive,
19		strategic approach to the development of policies that
20		promote the prevention of national and international
21		conflict, nonviolent intervention, mediation, peaceful

1		resolution of conflict, and structured mediation of
2		conflict; [and]
3	(7)	Provide for exchanges of individuals between Hawaii
4		and other nations to develop international and peace-
5		based initiatives [+];
6	(8)	Be the State's central point of contact and
7		accountability in international affairs and serve as
8		the State's advocate for a global orientation;
9	(9)	Inventory existing international programs and develop
10		a web-based information portal to make this
11		information available to the public;
12	(10)	Encourage the attraction of international conferences
13		to be held in Hawaii;
14	(11)	Encourage the development of international programming
15		and content on local radio shows and a dedicated
16		public access channel for international programs and
17		issues;
18	(12)	Facilitate an international educational links program
19		by increasing collaboration and coordination of
20		international, educational, business, and community
21		organizations and providing funding for activities
22		that shall include but not be limited to:

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1	(A)	School excursions from Asia to Hawaii schools,
2		targeting middle and high-school students from
3		Japan, Taiwan, Korea, Philippines, and China with
4		special focus on Hawaii's sister-states, using the
5		department of business, economic development, and
6		tourism and its overseas offices to market school
7		excursions to Hawaii and match these overseas
8		school visits with Hawaii schools;
9	<u>(B)</u>	Study abroad programs, targeting middle and high-
10		school students from Hawaii's schools, using the
11		department's overseas offices and focusing on
12		Hawaii's sister-states that match Hawaii schools
13		with overseas schools for school-to-school visits
14		and hosting. The office shall fund, and
15		encourage funding sources both public and private
16		to help finance the studies abroad; and
17	<u>(C)</u>	Teacher exchange programs through which teachers
18		from Hawaii and abroad exchange a period of time
19		in teaching. The office shall fund and encourage
20		funding sources both public and private to help
21		finance teaching abroad;

2	(13)	Facilitate an international leaders program by				
3		facilitating the collaboration and coordination of				
4		international, educational, business, and community				
5		organizations and funding activities that shall				
6		include but not be limited to:				
7		<u>(A)</u>	International conferences for high-school			
8			students involving international organizations			
9			such as the East West Center and the Pacific			
10			Asian Affairs Council;			
11		<u>(B)</u>	Adopt-a-school programs partnering international			
12			companies and organizations schools for cultural			
13			and educational enrichment; and			
14		<u>(C)</u>	School competitions to become a high-school			
15			fellow at international agencies' programs.			
16	[(e)	Notw	withstanding any other law to the contrary, if any			
17	of the re	spons	ibilities or duties of the office of international			
18	affairs u	nder	this section overlap with the responsibilities or			
19	duties of another agency or authority under this chapter, the					
20	office of	office of international affairs shall have exclusive				
21	jurisdict	sdiction and authority over those responsibilities and				
22	duties.]"					

- 1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$531,000 or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the
- 4 sum of \$518,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary fiscal
- 5 year 2008-2009 for the hiring of an executive director and
- $\mathbf{6}$ administrative assistant for the office of international affairs
- 7 and for operating and program expenses.
- 8 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 9 of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes
- 10 of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000 or so much
- 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 to bring
- 14 the Second International Symposium on Freeway and Tollway
- 15 Operations to Hawaii in 2009 and to begin preliminary planning
- 16 for the 2009 conference.
- 17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 18 Hawaii at Manoa, college of engineering, for the purposes of
- 19 this Act.
- 20 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 22 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
