

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Hawaii is home to two of the world's premier 2 astronomy observatories, Haleakala on Maui and Mauna Kea on the 3 island of Hawaii. Mauna Kea is considered the finest 4 observation site in the world. One of the most critical ways to 5 preserve the value of these sites is to reduce bright sources of 6 light that penetrate the dark night sky. However, recent nighttime images from the international space station revealed 7 8 that some of the brightest sources of light on Maui and Hawaii 9 are the airports and harbors on both islands. Also, astronomers 10 on Mauna Kea have detected artificial light sources from urban 11 areas that diminish the telescopes' ability to assist with 12 research. 13 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- The purpose of this Act is to require the department of transportation, to the extent that is practical, to comply with county ordinances and standards relating to outside lighting at airports, harbors, and highways.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 262, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: "§262- Outdoor lighting. To the extent that it is 4 5 practical and not in conflict with any safety regulation or 6 federal law, regulation, or mandate, in the event that any 7 airport regulations or standards relating to outdoor lighting on 8 runways, ramp or apron areas, roadways, and parking lots are in 9 conflict with any county ordinance or other regulations 10 regarding the same areas, the more stringent requirement or standard to reduce bright sources of light that penetrate the 11 12 dark night sky shall govern all new installations." 13 SECTION 3. Chapter 264, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to part III to be appropriately 14 designated and to read as follows: 15 "§264- Highway lighting. To the extent that it is 16 **17** practical and not in conflict with any safety regulation or 18 federal law, regulation, or mandate, in the event that any 19 highway regulations or standards relating to highway lighting are in conflict with any county ordinance or other regulations 20 21 regarding highway lighting, the more stringent requirement or

3	SECTION 4. Chapter 266, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
5	designated and to read as follows:
6	"§266- Outdoor lighting. To the extent that it is
7	practical and not in conflict with any safety regulation or
8	federal law, regulation, or mandate, in the event that any
9	harbor regulations or standards relating to outdoor lighting at
10	any harbor facility conflict with any county ordinance or other
11	regulations regarding the same areas, the more stringent
12	requirement or standard to reduce bright sources of light that
13	penetrate the dark night sky shall govern all new
14	installations."
15	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.

Description:
