A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PETROLEUM PRICE GOUGING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Hawaii's geographic isolation has made it
 particularly vulnerable to high gasoline prices, particularly
 during abnormal disruptions of the gasoline market. Gasoline is
 one product that consumers cannot live without. No one should
 be allowed to take advantage of abnormal market conditions to
 gouge Hawaii consumers of this precious commodity.

7 Due to recent catastrophic events, the cost of gasoline has become a concern for consumers nationally and locally. 8 9 Currently, absent a local natural disaster or a formal 10 declaration of emergency by the governor, the only way that the State can prosecute someone for price gouging is pursuant to the 11 unfairness doctrine of chapter 480, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 12 13 This Act will enhance enforcement authority by specifically 14 making it an unfair or deceptive trade practice for any 15 gasoline-related business to sell or offer to sell any gasoline 16 product for an amount that represents an unconscionably 17 excessive price during any abnormal disruption of the market,

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whether that disruption occurred in Hawaii or in other parts of 1 2 the world. The purpose of this Act is to protect Hawaii consumers from 3 price gouging in the purchase of gasoline during periods of 4 abnormal disruption of the marketplace caused by extraordinary 5 6 adverse circumstances. 7 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new chapter to title 26 to be appropriately designated 8 9 and to read as follows: 10 "CHAPTER GASOLINE PRICE GOUGING 11 12 S -1 Short title. This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Gasoline Price Gouging Act of 2007". 13 -2 Definitions. For purposes of this chapter, unless 14 S the context clearly provides otherwise: 15 16 "Abnormal disruption of the market" means any change in the market resulting from an actual or imminently threatened stress 17 of weather, convulsion of nature, failure or shortage of 18 19 electric power or other source of energy, strike, civil 20 disorder, war, military action, or national or local emergency. 21 "Gasoline product" includes gasoline, benzol, benzine, naphtha, and any other liquid prepared, advertised, offered for 22 HB1595 HD1 LRB 07-2198.doc

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sale, sold for use as, or used for the generation of power for
 the propulsion of motor vehicles, including any product obtained
 by blending together any one or more petroleum products with or
 without other products, if the resultant product is capable of
 the same use.

6 § -3 Gasoline price gouging as unfair or deceptive act 7 or practice. (a) It shall constitute an unfair or deceptive 8 act or practice in the conduct of any trade or commerce under 9 section 480-2 for any gasoline-related business to sell or offer 10 to sell any gasoline product for an amount that represents an 11 unconscionably excessive price during any abnormal disruption of 12 the market.

(b) A price is unconscionably excessive if the amount
charged represents a gross disparity between the price of the
gasoline product and:

16 (1) The price at which the same grade of gasoline product
17 was sold or offered for sale by the gasoline-related
18 business in the usual course of business immediately
19 prior to the onset of the abnormal disruption of the
20 market; or

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1 The price at which the same or similar grade of (2) 2 gasoline product is readily obtainable by other buyers 3 in the trade area, 4 and the disparity is not substantially attributable to increased prices charged by suppliers to the gasoline-related business or 5 increased costs attributable to market forces beyond the control 6 of the gasoline-related business selling or offering to sell the 7 8 gasoline product."

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
