A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The de facto population of the county of Maui 1 increased thirty-five per cent from 134,569 in 1990 to 181,534 2 in 2005. The populations living in Kahului, Kihei, and Lahaina 3 are the three highest in Maui county with the exception of 4 Wailuku. For transportation purposes, Wailuku, which ranks 5 third in population behind Kahului and Kihei, can be considered 6 as a twin of Kahului -- the two contiguous towns almost as one. 7 These towns are also among the favorite destinations of visitors 8 to Maui and the roads connecting them are heavily traveled. 9 purpose of this Act is to determine the cost feasibility of 10 constructing a fixed rail system of transportation connecting 11 the Kahului-Wailuku area, Kihei, and Lahaina. 12 SECTION 2. (a) The department of transportation shall 13 conduct a study to determine the cost feasibility of 14

15 constructing a fixed rail system of transportation connecting 16 the Kahului-Wailuku area, Kihei, and Lahaina on the island of 17 Maui. The department shall identify and select various fixed

18 rail transportation systems for examination. The department



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- 1 shall also consider and examine all relevant potential issues
- 2 such as land use, lease or purchase of land, the exercise of
- 3 eminent domain, environmental effects, disruption to existing
- 4 traffic flow, as well as actual planning, engineering, and
- 5 construction costs of the system with minimum and maximum number
- 6 of stations on the line and their location, including the
- 7 adequate supply of labor to carry out such a project.
- 8 (b) The department of transportation shall submit an
- 9 interim report and a final report to the governor and the
- 10 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 11 the regular sessions of 2008 and 2009, respectively. The
- 12 reports shall contain final cost estimates and a detailed
- 13 discussion of potential impediments to the construction of a
- 14 fixed rail system on Maui and recommendations to overcome these
- 15 impediments.
- 16 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so much
- 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the
- 19 same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 20 2008-2009, for the department of transportation to conduct a
- 21 study to determine the cost feasibility of constructing a fixed



- 1 rail system of transportation connecting the Kahului-Wailuku
- 2 area, Kihei, and Lahaina on the island of Maui.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 4 of transportation for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
