A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF A SHELLFISH AQUACULTURE INDUSTRY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that as the state has 2 transitioned away from plantation agriculture, diversified 3 agriculture has become an essential component of our overall 4 agriculture industry. Aquaculture, which reached \$28,400,000 in 5 wholesale product value in 2005, represents one of the fastest 6 growing sectors of diversified agriculture in the state, with a 7 future brimming with potential. Our state has an opportunity to expand its burgeoning aquacultural industry by encouraging the 8 9 culturing of shellfish, including clams and oysters, on land and 10 in certain areas of the ocean. 11 However, federal regulations require certain procedures and 12 testing to be able to sell cultured oysters and clams locally and for export. In addition, the state department of health 13 14 allows the import of live shellfish for food, but not culturing of shellfish for local consumption and export. This is a missed 15 opportunity for local shellfish growers, who are growing clams 16 and oysters for seed export sales, but are not permitted to grow 17
